Recognition of certificate or other document obtained in the foreign educational system

Proceedings for the recognition of a certificate or other document are not carried out in relation to certificates or other documents obtained in foreign educational systems that document the completion of the school year or graduation, if their holder intends to continue education in Poland in primary or secondary school. The decision on admission to the appropriate class is made by the headmaster of the selected school.

Recognition of the same certificate obtained abroad may be done only once.

Certificates referred to in items a-d below do not require recognition, therefore, may be filed directly with a university, institution or employer without the requirement for additional opinions and certificates.

Upper secondary education and qualifications for applying for admission to tertiary education are confirmed in the Republic of Poland by:

a) certificates and other documents issued by a school or educational institution from the educational system of a member state of the European Union, member state of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) – party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area or a member state of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), qualifying for applying for admission to tertiary education in these states,

The foregoing applies to secondary school leaving certificates obtained in the following states: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Chile, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, the Netherlands, Spain, Ireland, Island, Israel, Japan, Canada, South Korea, Lichtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Latvia, Malta, Mexico, Germany, Norway, New Zealand, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Sweden, Turkey, USA, Hungary, UK, Italy.

- b) IB (International Baccalaureate) diplomas issued by the International Baccalaureate Organization in Geneva,
- c) EB (European Baccalaureate) diplomas issued by the European Schools in accordance with the Convention Defining the Stature of the European Schools, done in Luxembourg
- d) certificates covered by international agreements. List of agreements https://www.gov.pl/web/edukacja-i-nauka/umowy-dwustronne-dotyczace-uznawalnosci-wyksztalcenia

I. Required documents:

- 1. Application for recognition of certificate issued abroad (form No. 1);
- Certificates issued abroad may be recognised as a document confirming in the Republic of Poland
 primary education, lower secondary education, basic vocational education or upper secondary education
 or qualifications for further education, including qualifications for applying for admission to tertiary
 education, with account taken of the scope of qualifications in the state in which the certificate was
 issued;
- The application should be filed with the education superintendant having territorial jurisdiction over the applicant's place of residence or, if the applicant does not have a place of residence in the territory of the Republic of Poland, with the education superintendant having territorial jurisdiction over the registered office of the institution with which the applicant intends to file the certificate.

2. Certificate:

a) original of the certificate with apostille placed on or attached to the document or a duplicate of the certificate with apostille placed on or attached to the document or a notarised copy of the certificate with apostille placed on or attached to the document;

The original of the certificate, a duplicate of the certificate or a notarised copy of the certificate with apostille placed on or attached to the document by a relevant authority of the state in which the certificate was issued should be filed if the certificate was issued by a school or educational institution from a state being party to the Convention Abolishing the Requirement of Legalisation for Foreign Public Documents, done at the Hague on 5 October 1961 ("Dziennik Ustaw" [Journal of Laws] of 2005, No. 112, items 938 and 939).

The original of the certificate or a duplicate of the certificate is presented for inspection.

or

b) legalised original of the certificate or a duplicate of the certificate – if the certificate was issued by a state which is not a party to the Hague Convention;

The original of the certificate or a duplicate of the certificate should be legalised by:

- a consul of the Republic of Poland appointed for the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued, or
- educational authorities of the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued, or
- diplomatic mission or consular office of the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued, accredited in the Republic of Poland or other member state of the European Union, member state of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area or a member state of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).
- 3. If the certificate does not contain information about the course of education, the following should be appended, the documents referred to in section 3 should be issued or confirmed by the school or educational institution which issued the certificate or by educational authorities of the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued:
- a) statement of grades received at the examination conditioning graduation from a school or educational institution or credit for a given stage of education,
- b) statement of subjects and other activities completed at a given stage of education, together with grades,
- c) information about the completed curriculum concerning:
- the curriculum content,
- the planned period of learning,
- the grading scale,
- d) information about obtained qualifications for further education at a relevant level in the state in which the certificate was issued, including information about qualifications for applying for admission to tertiary education and the scope of such qualifications;
- 4. Translation into Polish of the certificate, after legalisation or placement/attachment of appostille, and other documents in a foreign language, prepared or attested by:
- a person entered by the Minister of Justice in the Roll of Sworn Translators, or

- a person registered as a sworn translator in a member state of the European Union, member state of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area or a member state of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), or
- a consul of the Republic of Poland appointed for the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued, or
- diplomatic mission or consular office, accredited in the Republic of Poland, of the state on whose territory or in whose educational system the certificate was issued;

In the event that there are material difficulties with translation of documents into Polish, the educational superintendant may agree to accept a translation prepared by other entity whose credibility raises no doubts.

- 5. Authorisation (form No. 2) if the applicant is not the person to whom the certificate was issued;
- 6. Photocopy of ID document confirming personal data of the owner of the certificate.

II. Place of filing:

III. Application deadline:

Applications together with documentation may be filed all year long.

1 month, in complicated cases -2 months.
