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Participating entities must be established as legal persons³ and must conduct business, R&D activity or any other activity on the territory of the Republic of Poland, confirmed by an entry into the relevant Polish official register⁴.

For enterprises it is strongly advised to state in the pre-proposal application form the KRS (National Court Register) number of the enterprise and the size of the enterprise (micro/small, medium, large);

For a group of entities to participate as an Applicant in the call, it must formally exist on the date the pre-proposal is submitted. This existence must be evidenced by an agreement made by the members - at least conditionally - to create the group of entities (consortium).

An Ukrainian researcher:

1. has Ukrainian citizenship, holds at least a Master (Магістр) or Specialist (Спеціаліст) degree obtained in Ukraine (or an equivalent degree obtained outside Ukraine). As a result of the armed conflict on the territory of Ukraine, the researcher is either :
 - a) a resident in Poland who arrived in Poland no earlier than 24 February 2022; or
 - b) a resident in Ukraine unable to continue their academic career or work in research and development (R&D)
2. is employed by a Polish Applicant under the relevant contract. Both the Polish Applicant as well as the Ukrainian researcher, undertake to comply with Polish employment law.
3. contributes to research works in the project, i.e. industrial research and/or experimental development. The added value of their participation in the project must be scientifically justified and described in both the proposal and the national application.

The Polish Applicant shall provide documentary evidence confirming that all eligibility criteria of Ukrainian researcher are met. Such evidence shall include, but not be limited to: proof of Ukrainian citizenship, academic qualifications, residence status and date of arrival, proof of employment under relevant contract with the Polish Applicant, and documentation demonstrating the researcher's contribution to the project. The evidence shall be submitted on NCBR request in due time.

Funding quotas for Polish participants may reach up to 100% for universities and research organisations. For enterprises, the quota will be determined on a case-by-case basis, taking into account company size and the type of research and development activity, pursuant to Section 2 of the Regulation of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 19 August 2020 on granting state aid by the National Centre for Research and Development (Journal of Laws 2020, item 1456).

In any case only Industrial Research and Experimental Development are eligible for funding. Other activities (e.g. coordination, dissemination, management) shall not be included into separate tasks.

For entrepreneurs independently undertaking projects at the national level (meaning there is no Polish group of entities or Polish group of enterprises), there is no possibility of increasing the intensity of state aid for industrial research and experimental development based on the condition of effective cooperation between entrepreneurs or between entrepreneurs and research organisations.

Only Industrial/Applied Research and Experimental Development will be funded. Other type of activities (e.g. coordination, dissemination, management) is not eligible for funding as separate research tasks in the project schedule.

After international evaluation of full proposals and the selection of projects to be funded, Polish participants will be invited to submit a National Application Form (NAF). The NAFs will be examined for the appropriateness of funding requested. The Polish participants are obliged to use the rate of exchange of the European Central Bank dated on the day of opening of the call. If more than one Polish entity participates in the project, the national application is submitted by a consortium (group of entities) of all Polish partners.
