The second day of integration and learning about Irish culture by project participants. New experience in the field of human anatomy drawing and other types of specializations.



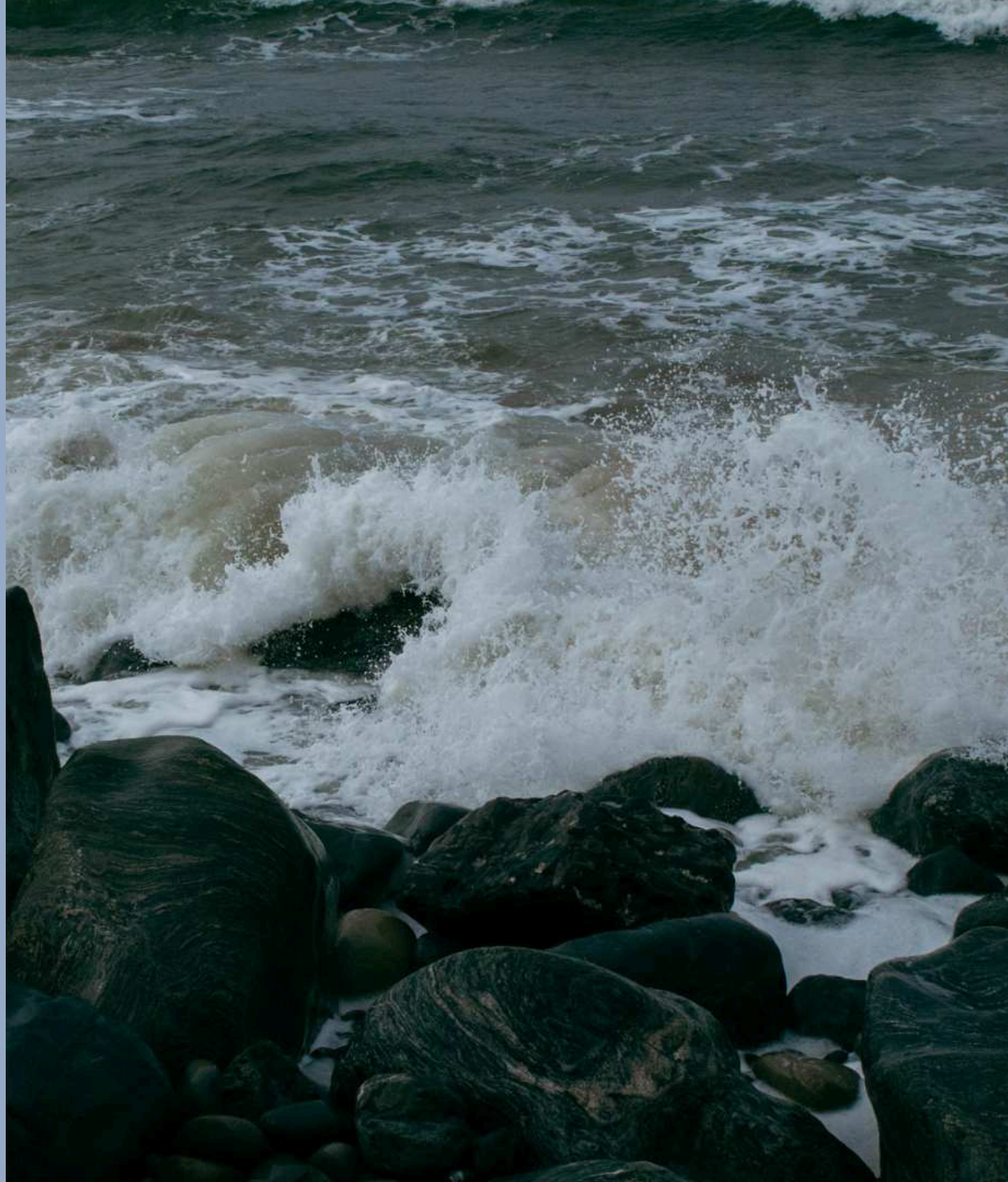

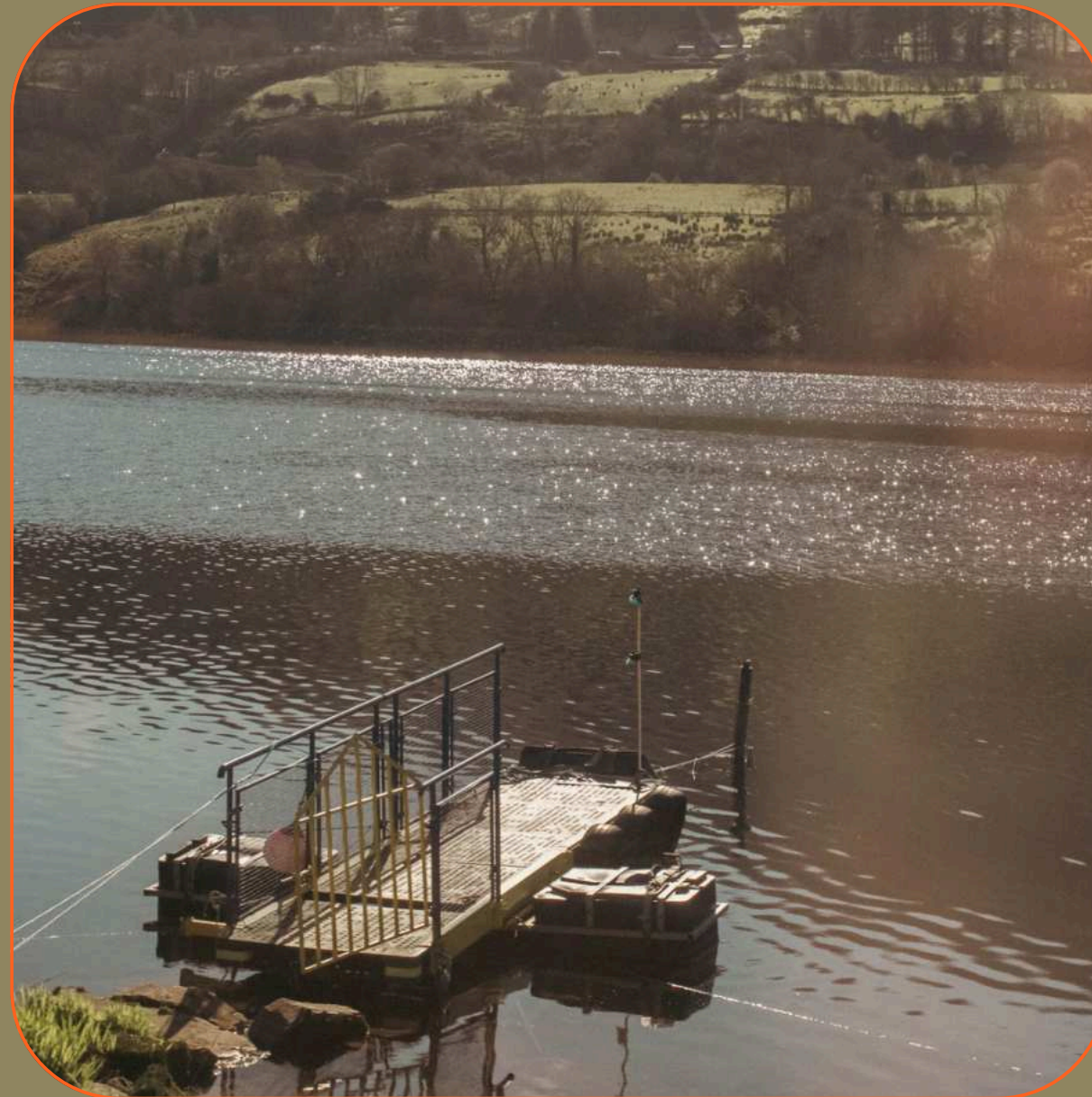


# Visiting the historical and cultural monuments of Sligo

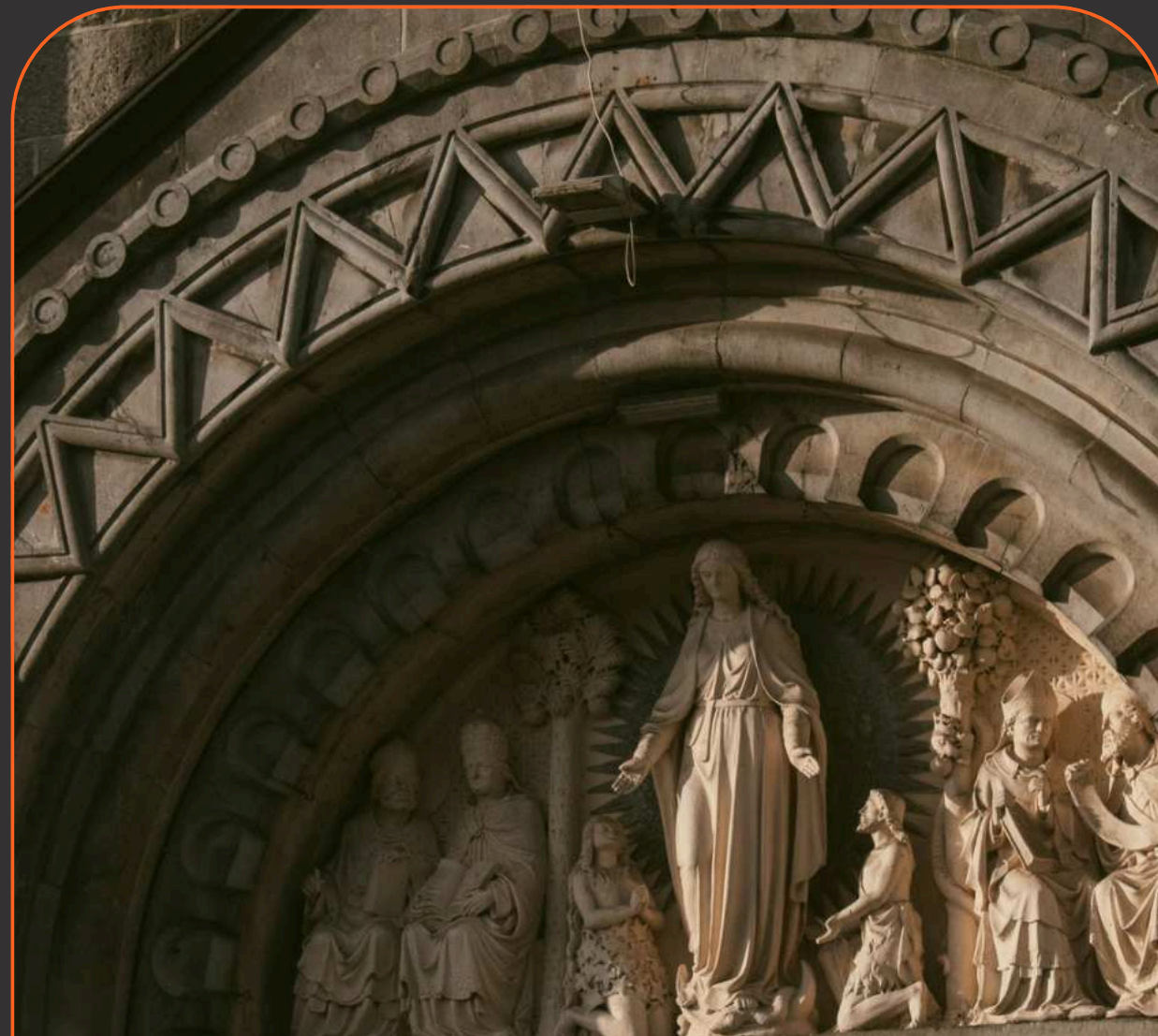
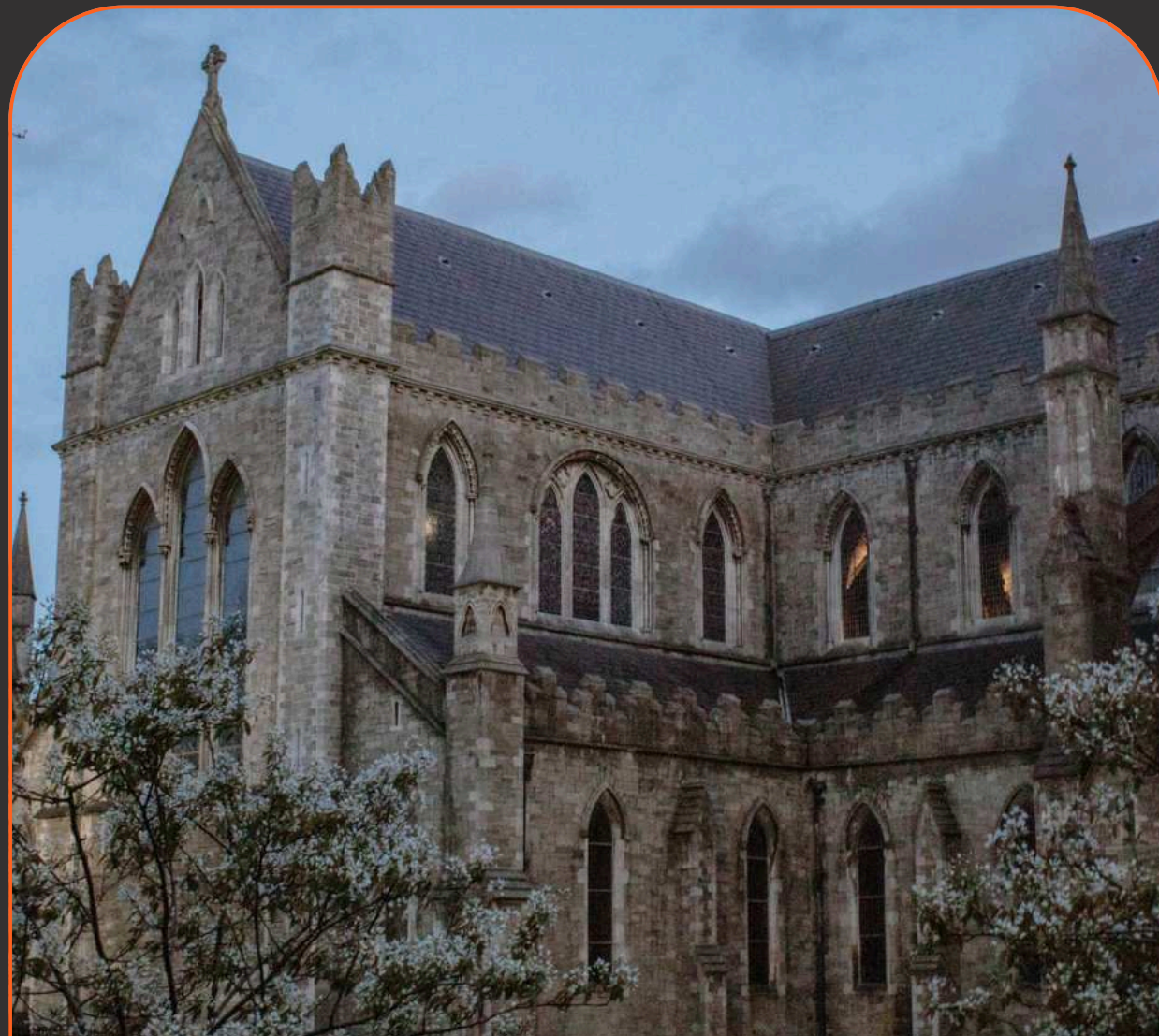
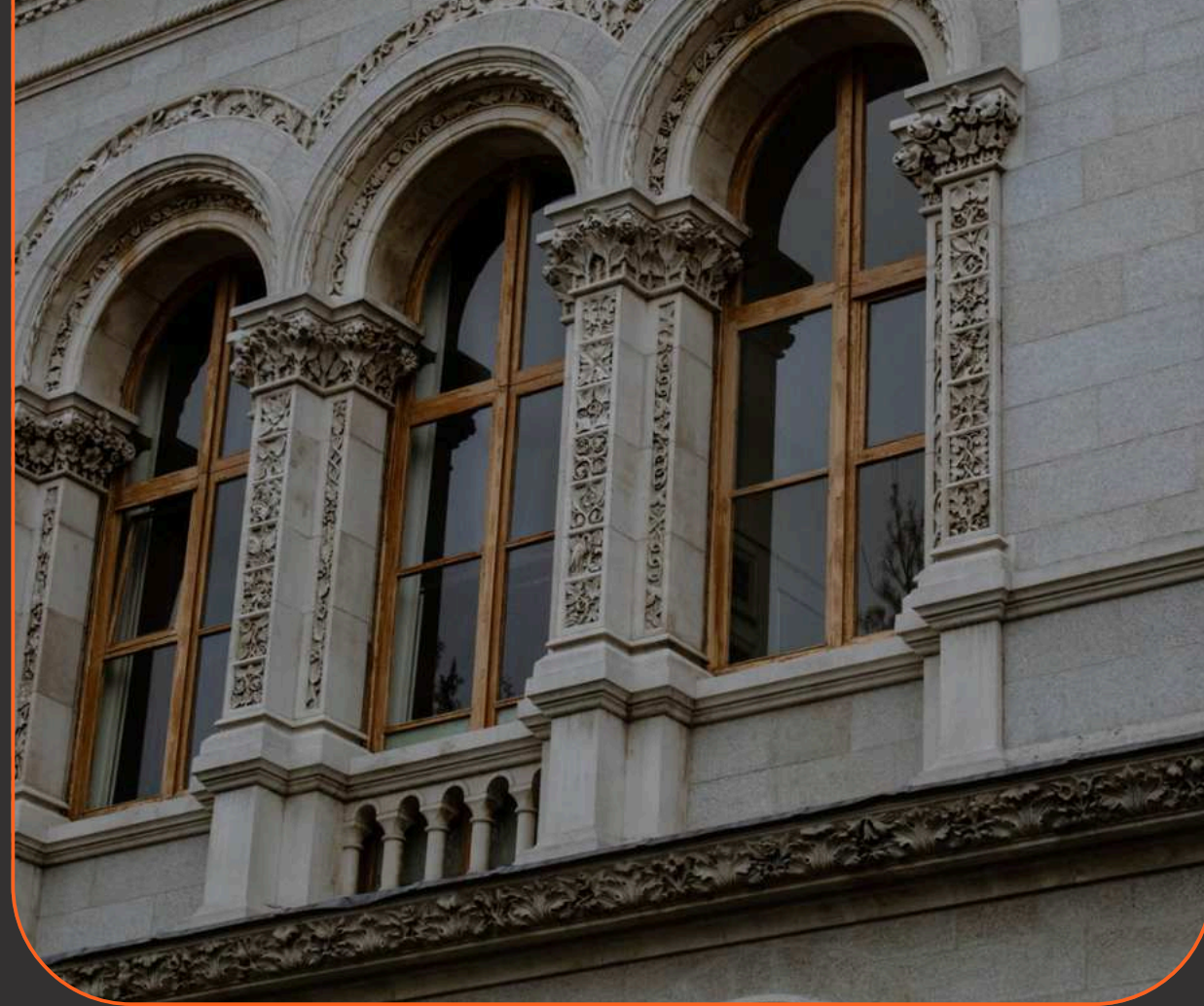
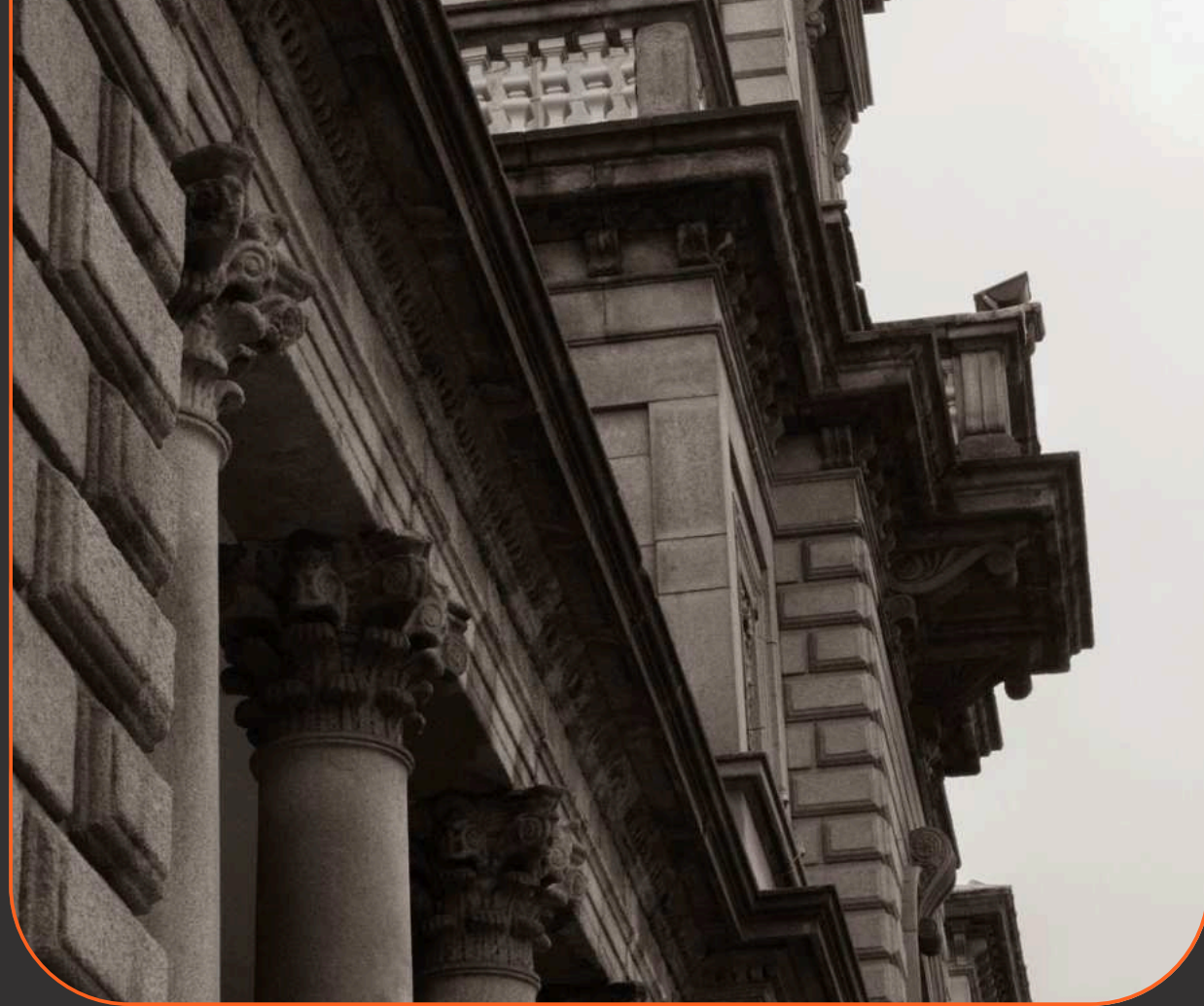


# Visiting monuments and famous historical Irish places in Dublin

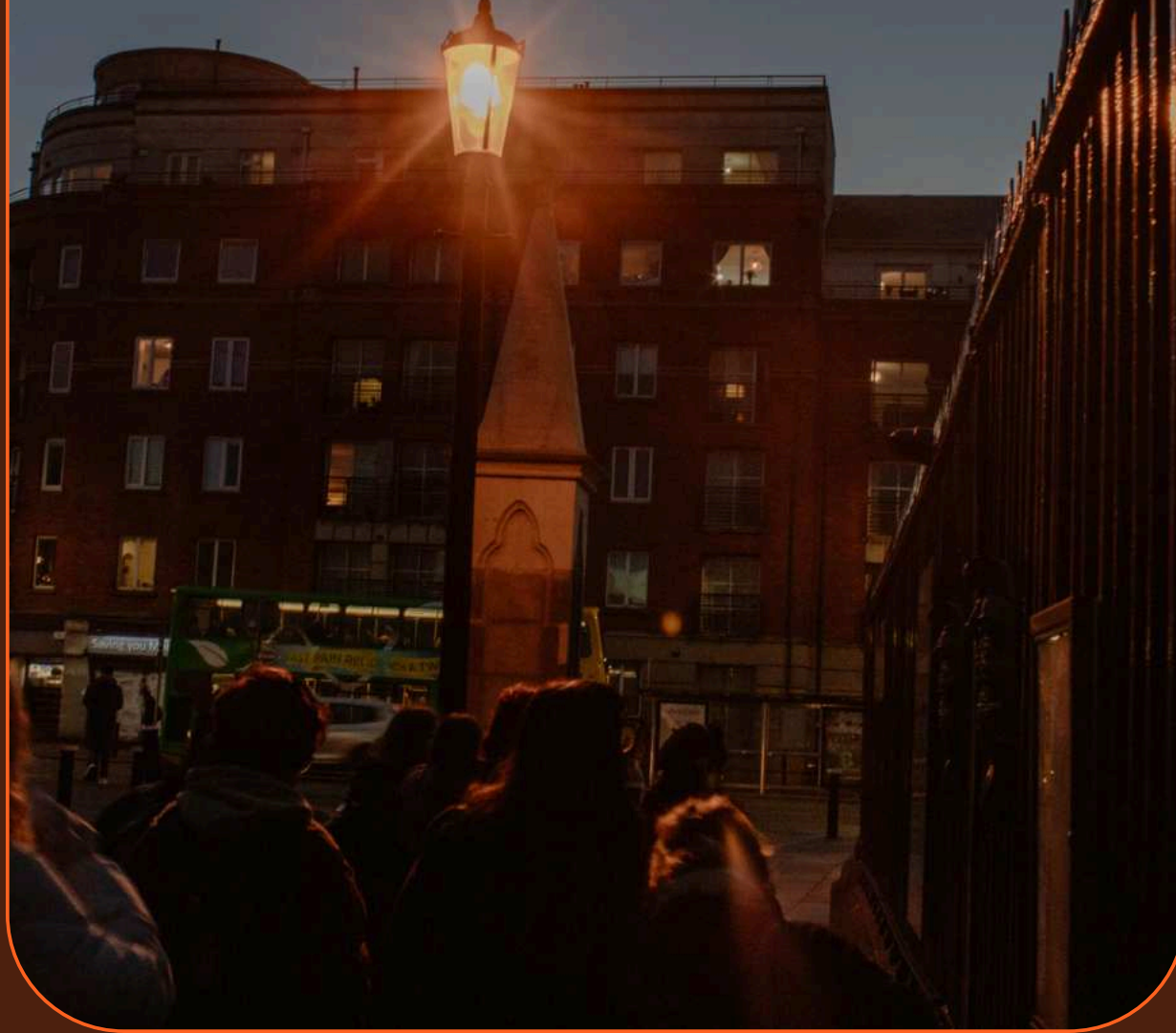

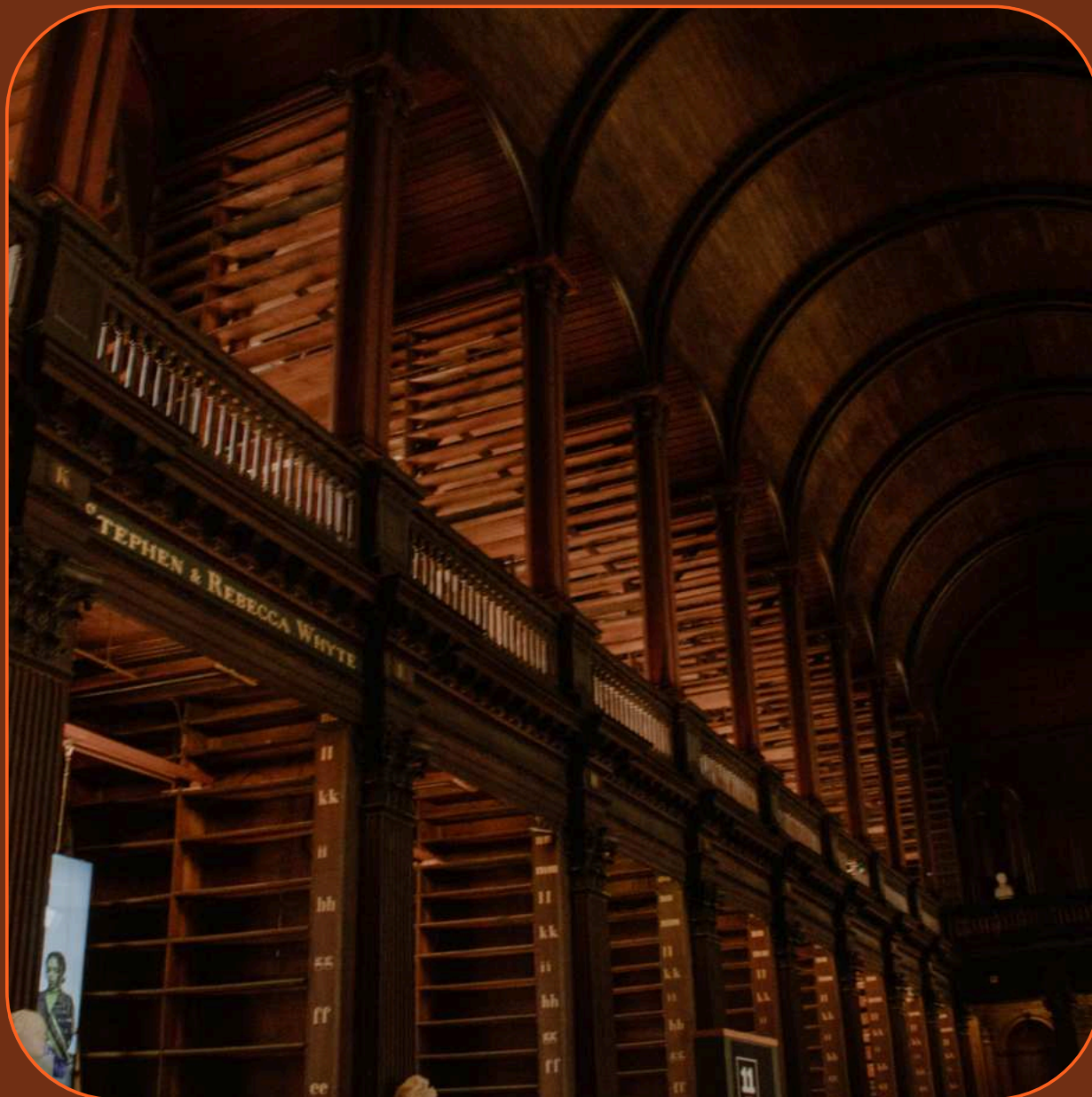
