**RESOLUTION No. 23/2025
OF THE SCIENCE EVALUATION COMMITTEE
of 30 July 2025**

on the evaluation of the quality of education at a doctoral school

Pursuant to Article 259 (1) and Article 262 (2) of the Act of 20 July 2018 - Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), hereinafter referred to as the "Act", having reviewed the result of the evaluation referred to in Article 262 (1) of the Act, which was carried out by the Evaluation Team, the Science Evaluation Committee

positively evaluate the quality of education

at the Doctoral School

run by

Wroclaw University of Economics and Business.

This evaluation applies to the period from 1 October 2019 to 18 December 2024.

Justification:

The education programme at the Doctoral School is coherent and appropriate to the learning outcomes at level 8 of the Polish Qualifications Framework. The School has designed a clear development path for doctoral students. The School's academic staff are highly qualified and committed to the teaching process. The School has an effective system for selecting instructors, who are regularly assessed by the Doctoral School Council and the doctoral candidates. The educational quality assurance system is effective. The School provides doctoral students with strong institutional facilities for research development. Doctoral candidates benefit from services such as the Research Support Centre, Project Management Centre and internal grant competitions, which effectively support the implementation of Individual Research Plans and their academic development. Doctoral students have the opportunity to develop leadership and social skills. The School creates a friendly, supportive environment for doctoral students. Those with special needs receive real support. The doctoral recruitment process at the School is open, transparent and substantive. The mid-term evaluation is conducted with great care, ensuring not only an objective assessment of doctoral candidates' progress but also providing valuable, constructive feedback to support their further development. At the same time, a few recommendations have been prepared for the Doctoral School that could further enhance the training process for early-career researchers, while emphasising that the overall evaluation of the Doctoral School is unequivocally positive.
