Subject: Request to initiate proceedings concerning the TikTok platform under Regulation (EU) 2022/2065 (Digital Services Act)

Dear Executive Vice President,

I hereby submit a request for supervisory action and the initiation of proceedings concerning the TikTok platform in connection with the large-scale dissemination of artificial intelligence-generated content encouraging the withdrawal of the Republic of Poland from the European Union. These materials are being published in the Polish-language segment of the platform and exhibit characteristics of a coordinated disinformation campaign.

The disclosed content poses a threat to public order, information security, and the integrity of democratic processes in Poland and across the European Union. The nature of the narratives, the manner in which they are distributed, and the use of synthetic audiovisual materials indicate that the platform is failing to comply with the obligations imposed on it as a Very Large Online Platform (VLOP).

Available information suggests that TikTok has not implemented adequate mechanisms for moderating AI-generated content, nor has it ensured effective transparency measures regarding the origin of such materials, which undermines the objectives of the Digital Services Act concerning the prevention of disinformation and the protection of users.

In light of the above, I would like to propose that the European Commission:

1. Initiate investigative proceedings concerning TikTok in connection with suspected breaches of the DSA relating to systemic risk management and content moderation.
2. Impose an obligation on TikTok to submit a detailed report on the scale and nature of the disclosed content, its reach, and the actions taken to remove it and prevent further dissemination.
3. Consider the application of interim measures aimed at limiting the continued spread of AI-generated content encouraging the withdrawal of the Republic of Poland from the European Union.
4. Ensure coordination with the Polish Digital Services Coordinator (UKE) and notify the relevant national authorities of the outcome of the proceedings.

The scale of this phenomenon, its potential consequences for political stability, and the use of generative technologies to undermine democratic foundations require an immediate response from the institutions of the European Union.
