

Joint Press Statement on the Polish - Mongolian Political Consultations

Ulaanbaatar, 5 June 2026

On 5 June 2026 Republic of Poland and Mongolia held Political Consultations in Ulaanbaatar at the level of Deputy Foreign Ministers. In the spirit of Comprehensive Partnership between Poland and Mongolia and according to the Action Plan for Comprehensive Partnership between both countries Mr. Władysław T. Bartoszewski, Secretary of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland and Mr. Gombosuren Amartuvshin, Deputy Foreign Minister of Mongolia led the talks and discussed a wide range of bilateral, regional and international agenda issues.

The two sides stressed that both governments remain committed to developing bilateral relations between Mongolia and Poland in all sectors, especially in the food industry, food industry machinery and agriculture, IT, green technologies, healthcare, pharmaceuticals, renewable energy, infrastructure, as well as urban modernization and transport.

Both sides noted with satisfaction that the Ministries of Finance of Poland and Mongolia concluded the signing of the Annex to the Tied Aid Credit Agreement. Within the framework of this agreement Polish companies are supplying fire engines, field hospitals, ambulances, as well as building water and waste treatment facilities across Mongolia.

The parties underscored the important role of education, academic cooperation, and people-to-people exchanges in strengthening mutual understanding and fostering long-term ties between the two countries.

The two delegations noted the establishment of regular contacts between the National Security Bureau of the Republic of Poland and the National Security Council of Mongolia and the willingness expressed by both sides to conclude a framework agreement on further cooperation.

The two sides welcomed the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Institute of National Remembrance of the Republic of Poland and the State Commission for Political Exoneration Management of Mongolia and expressed confidence that it would contribute to strengthening cooperation, research activities, and exchanges between the two institutions.
