## **OBJECTIVES OF THE CITIES MISSION**



Deliver at least 100 climate-neutral and smart European cities by 2030;



Ensure that these cities act as experimentation and innovation hubs to put all European cities in a position to become climate-neutral by 2050.

#### • 100 EU cities selected from all Member States and of different types

(size, current emissions, level of preparedness), representing **12% of the EU population**.

### **PRIORITIES**

- 1. Climate City Contracts
- 2. Synergies with other programmes
- 3. National networks





### **REVIEW OF CLIMATE CITY CONTRACTS**

- 3 parts: Main commitments (core contract), Action Plan, Investment Plan
- Two cut-off dates per year: April and October
- Completeness check and review by all relevant actors, EC and independent experts
- Endorsement by Mission Manager → Award of Mission label





#### Synergies with other EU programmes

- Work in progress
  - **Connecting Europe Facility**: All relevant calls that opened in September 2022 for projects on the TEN-T network (in total more than EUR 5 billion) include participation in the Cities Mission as an award criterion under "priority and urgency"; to be carried on in future calls.
  - LIFE Strategic Integrated Projects Climate Action: Urban or community-based action plans pioneering the transition to climate neutral and/or climate resilient society, including climate-neutral cities plans and actions, for instance in the context of the EU Mission 'Climate-neutral and smart cities' and Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans.
  - **Regional Operational Programmes**: References to the Cities Mission in many national and regional programmes, in particular in regions with cities participating in the Cities Mission.
  - **NEW Urban Innovative Action**: References to the Cities Mission and the Adaptation Mission in call topic "greener cities" to be published in June (overall budget EUR 120 million)
  - **NEW European Innovation Council (EIC)**: Call to increase the purchase of innovative solutions by public and private buyers with specific reference to Cities Mission to be opened in June (CSA with a budget of up to EUR 3 million)





## **IMPORTANCE OF NATIONAL NETWORKS**

- Key role for **federal and regional authorities**:
  - Financial and regulatory support much beyond R&I
  - Cross-sectoral (horizontal) and multi-level (vertical) cooperation
  - Involvement as co-signatories of Climate City Contracts
  - Support for non-selected cities
- Spain, Sweden, Austria, France and Greece already have active national networks
- Support for national networks via the CapaCITIES project





### LATEST UPDATES

- City Advisors are working with cities
- First Pilot programme and Twinning programme have started, second Pilot programme closed
- Three summer/winter schools for Mission cities
- Submission of **Climate City Contracts** for Commission review
- Announcement of first Mission labels on 12 October 2023 (during European Week of Cities and Regions)
- Evaluation of Missions Communication of 19 July 2023
