



Arkadiusz Pluciński is a lawyer and senior diplomat serving as Deputy Permanent Representative of Poland to the European Union since 2019. In 2025, he chaired COREPER I during Poland's rotating Presidency of the Council of the European Union, steering legislative negotiations across a broad range of policy areas and ensuring effective interinstitutional cooperation with the European Parliament and the European Commission.

Earlier in his career he worked at the Office of the Committee for European Integration, contributing to Poland's preparations for accession to the European Union (2002–2004). As Director of the EU Law Department (2004–2010), he oversaw the transposition and implementation of EU law and Poland's representation in proceedings before the Court of Justice of the European Union.

From 2010 to 2014, he served at the Secretariat-General of the European Commission, working on horizontal issues related to the application and enforcement of EU law. He subsequently headed the Institutional and Legal Section at the Permanent Representation of Poland to the European Union (2014–2019), coordinating interinstitutional and legal dossiers.

He holds a master's degree of law from the University of Szczecin and completed advanced postgraduate programmes at the National School of Public Administration in Warsaw and the University of Sussex in Brighton.
