## REGULATION OF THE MINISTER OF HEALTH<sup>1</sup>

of 08 June 2020

### on the scope of information contained in the Central Database for Medical Exposures<sup>2</sup>

Pursuant to Article 33zf(4) of the Act of 29 November 2000 - the Atomic Law (Dz. U. of 2019, item 1792, and of 2020, item 284 and 322), it is ordered as follows:

§ 1. This Regulation shall define the scope of information contained in the Central Database for Medical Exposures, hereinafter referred to as the 'Database'.

§ 2. 1. The Database shall contain information on medical exposures performed in health care units under specific medical radiological procedures in the fields of X-ray diagnostics, interventional radiology, nuclear medicine and radiotherapy.

2. The information referred to in paragraph 1 shall include an indication of:

- 1) number of uses of medical radiological procedures,
- 2) magnitude of exposure to ionising radiation from the use of medical radiological procedures,
  - for each of the scopes referred to in paragraph 1.

3. The information referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 shall be included in the Database broken down by:

- 1) gender;
- 2) age, including individuals under the age of 16 and individuals over the age of 16.

4. The magnitude of exposure referred to in paragraph 2(2) shall be expressed as an average effective dose per statistical inhabitant of the Republic of Poland.

§ 3. This Regulation shall enter into force 14 days following its promulgation.
