Purpose

1. In accordance with the provisions of Article XXXII of the NATO Financial Regulations and Financial Rules and Procedures, we are pleased to inform you that the RFP stated above has been issued by the NATO IS Procurement Service.

- 2. The purpose of this Request For Proposal (RFP) is to award a contract for the provision of Management Development Programme. The main scope the contract covers:
 - a. Provision of core management-related MDP training cycles at least one in English and one in French in particular year of the contract, consisting of maximum four modules delivered in NATO HQ. Each cycle must have no more than 4 onsite modules of maximum 2 days each, with a laps time between the modules of around 6 weeks. The cycle should be based on a blended learning approach including e.g. self-assessments, 360° assessment, onsite modules, onsite or remote coaching, on-line delivery, case studies, group assignments and discussions.
 - b. Provision of complementary to MDP stand-alone management-related trainings that would be offered to staff. The duration shall be one or two days depending on the topic such as: Team management and dynamics; Communication excellence; Results orientation; Stakeholder management; Personal effectiveness.

Governing Rules and Eligibility

- 4. This procurement action will follow the Formal Procurement procedure specified in Reference A.
- 5. To be eligible to participate in the bidding process, Bidders must:
 - a. Be from one of the NATO Member Nations, and be in sound legal and financial standing:
 - b. Have performed at least three (3) contracts within the last three (3) years substantially similar in scope to the requirements described in the solicitation;
 - c. Have sufficient capacity and resources to provide the services specified in the SOW:
 - d. Be otherwise qualified and eligible to receive an award under applicable requirements

Proposal content and closing date

- 6. Detailed instructions regarding the preparation, submission, and evaluation of proposals are provided in Part I of the RFP (Instructions for the Preparation and Submission of Proposals).
- 7. Aside from proof of the eligibility requirements stated above, Bidders must also provide the following main documentation as part of their proposals (see Part I, Section 4, of the RFP for further details about the mandatory composition of proposals):
 - a. Statements of legal and financial condition and other statements and certificates required to verify Bidder's financial and legal standing;
 - b. Data on relevant past performance and subcontracting arrangements;
 - c. Information about the proposed approach, services and capabilities;
 - d. Elaboration of any deviations to the terms and conditions of the proposed contract;
 - e. Price proposal.
- 8. <u>Proposals are due on 17 April 2020, at 15h00 (Brussels time)</u>. Final selection and contract award is expected in June 2020 (tentative). The contract will be effective for a period of three years with the possibility of two one-year extension options.

Evaluation Criteria and Contract Award

- 9. Bidders will be evaluated on the documentation submitted, a proposal oral presentation, a service trial period and other information and documentation available to the Organization (e.g. verification of past performance references). Considerations include: understanding of requirements and proposed approach, proposed resources and capabilities, past performance; legal risks; and the proposed price.
- 10. The contract will be awarded to the responsible Bidder whose conforming proposal represents the best value after evaluation in accordance with the factors and sub-factors specified in the solicitation. The detailed proposal evaluation factors, their relative importance, and the phases of the source selection process are described in Part I, Section 8, of the RFP.
