The centre of the national support scheme



The new system is built, financed and coordinated by the DKPK





Pierwsze kroki w Programie Ramowym Horyzont Europa

Jest to już 9. program ramowy w zakresie badań i innowacji, przewidziany na lata 2021–2027, z rekordowym budzetem ok. 95,5 mld euro. Każdy kolejny program jest kontynuacją poprzednich, ale też zawiera uaktualnenia wynikające ze zmieniających się uwarunkowań społecznych, gospodarczych czy ekologicznych. W nowym programie rozbudowano m.in. segment przeznaczony dla przedsiębiorców, położono duży nacisk na przedwidziałanie szkodliwym następstwom zmian klimatycznych i – co jest bardzo korzystne dla Polski – zaproponowano spory wachiarz instrumentów wspierających wyrównywanie szans krajów członkowskich (tzw. wieśning,

Zanim zaczniemy szukać konkursów i dokumentów, warto się zastanowić, czy projekt będziemy realizować jako instytucja indywidualna, czy będzie to konsorcjum międzynarodowe.

W Horyzoncie Europa większość projektów realizowana jest w konsorcjach międzynarodowych, a ich podstawową cechą jest udoskonalenie lub tworzenie nowej wiedzy/technologi/uproduktu czy usługi przy wykorzystaniu wiedzy partnerów składających się na konsorcjum projektowe. Należy przemyśleć, czy nasi dotychczasowi partnerzy zagraniczni będą zainteresowani wspólną aplikacją do konkursu w ramach Horyzontu Europa. Jeśli nie, w KPK podpowiemy, jak tworzyć konsorcjum.

W Horyzoncie Europa mamy również granty indywidualne – wspierające naukowców będących na różnych etapach kariery naukowej. Są to między innymi granty *Europejskiej Rady ds. Badań* (dla naukowców po doktoracie) i Działania Marii Składowskiej-Curie (MSCA) (tu na etapie składania wniosku naukowiec nie musi być zatrudniony, ale musi posladać uprawnienia do rozpoczęcia studiów doktoranckich).





Horizon Europe - funding

Type of Action	Funding rate
Research and innovation action	100%
Innovation action	70% (except for non-profit legal entities, where a rate of up to 100% applies)
Coordination and support action	100%
Programme co-fund action	Between 30% and 70%
Innovation and market deployment	70% (except for non-profit legal entities, where a rate of up to 100% applies)
Training and mobility action	100%
Pre-commercial procurement action	100%
Public procurement of innovative solutions action	50%





Horizon Europe - projects


Most often, * projects are carried out in transnational cooperation – consortia of **at least 3 partners from 3 different EU Member States** and/or associated countries

- > The quality of the projects is assessed by independent experts;
- Projects must have a European added value;
- > Basic evaluation criteria (a specific way of describing an idea):

Excellence,

Impact,

Implementation.

The Climate Change Adaptation Mission focuses on supporting EU regions, cities and local authorities in their efforts to build resilience to the impacts of climate change.
