EVALUATION OF THE EFFECTS OF THE REGULATION

1. What problem is solved?

The project consists in executing § 4 of the Regulation of the Council of Ministers of 15 February 2011 On the National Programme for Preventing HIV and Preventing AIDS (Journal of Laws, pos. 227). In accordance with § 4 (1) of the above-mentioned regulation, the Coordinator, i.e. the National AIDS Centre, a unit subject to and supervised by the Minister of Health, in collaboration with entities obliged to realize the National Programme for Preventing HIV Infections and Combating AIDS, prepares a schedule for the realization of the Programme and submits it to the Minister of Health, who, in accordance with § 4 (6) of the aforementioned Regulation, submits the schedule to the Council of Ministers for approval.

2. Recommended solution including planned tools of intervention and expected effect

On the basis of Article 4 (1) of the Act on Prevention and Combating Human Infections and Control of Infectious Diseases of 5 December 2008 (Journal of Laws 2016, pos. 1886), the Council of Ministers can determine, by regulation, programmes for preventing and combating specific infections or infectious diseases and drug resistance resulting from the epidemiological situation of the country or due to the necessity of adapting to international programmes, having in regard their effective implementation and providing health care to people whose particular vulnerability to infection is a result of the epidemiological situation. The state policy concerning HIV and AIDS has been set out in the Regulation by the Council of Ministers of 15 February 2011 on the National Programme for Preventing HIV and Combating AIDS.

The realization of the Programme is directed by the Minster of Health and the National AIDS Centre is the coordinator of the programme implementation. The competent ministers are the entities obliged to implement the Programme in accordance with the objectives of the Programme, local government administrational bodies and units subject to them constitute the entities obliged to implement the Programme. All entities obliged under separate regulations to develop and implement social policy strategies including social assistance programs, pro-family policies, promotion and protection of health, preventative and problem solving policies concerning alcoholism and drug addictions, and public education participate in implementing the tasks of the Programme. Entities conducting activities that enable undertaking tasks included in the schedule for implementing the Programme or running campaigns supporting its implementation can also participate in implementing the tasks of the Programme. The Programme assumes undertaking activities in five areas:

- 1) Prevention of HIV infections within the entire society;
- 2) Prevention of HIV infections among persons with higher levels of risky behaviour;
- 3) Support and healthcare for HIV positive persons and persons suffering from AIDS;
- 4) International cooperation;
- 5) Monitoring.

The Schedule for Implementation of the National Programme for Preventing HIV Infections and Combating AIDS developed for 2017-2021 includes all of the abovementioned areas.
