

Michał Mazur is a Polish career diplomat and civil servant who joined the foreign service in 2007. He currently serves as Poland's Representative to the Political and Security Committee.

Before this appointment, he worked at the Polish Permanent Representation to the European Union as an energy policy expert with a particular focus on relations with Ukraine and Moldova. During the latest Polish Presidency of the Council of the European Union, he headed the Unit on EU Enlargement and the Reconstruction of Ukraine, chairing the RESUA and IPCR UA groups. During Poland's first Presidency in 2011, he was entrusted with Antici duties, serving initially as Deputy Antici and subsequently as Antici until 2016.

Within the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Chancellery of the Prime Minister, Mr. Mazur has held a number of senior positions, including Deputy Director in the Department of European Policy, where he was responsible for EU institutional relations. He also served as a Member of the Cabinet of the European Minister and as Head of the European Energy Policy Coordination Unit. Over the course of his career, he has developed extensive expertise in institutional and enlargement matters, as well as in energy and climate policy. He has also gained valuable experience in bilateral diplomacy, serving as Deputy Director and policy expert on Asia, with responsibility for relations with Japan and New Zealand.

Mr. Mazur graduated from the Faculty of Law and Administration and the Faculty of International Relations at UMCS in Lublin, and from the National School of Public Administration in Warsaw (2007).

Over the course of his career, Mr. Mazur has specialized in institutional affairs and enlargement as well as energy and climate issues. He has also gained experience in bilateral diplomacy, serving as Deputy Director and policy expert on Asia (Japan and New Zealand).

His mother tongue is Polish. He is fluent in English and also speaks French.
