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# Development cooperation system

## 2.1. Development cooperation and Polish Aid

Polish development cooperation is composed of three elements: **development assistance**, or support for less developed countries in their socio-economic growth and transformation processes; **humanitarian aid**, provided for populations suffering from armed conflicts and natural disasters; and **global education**, the aim of which is to increase Polish society's awareness of global problems and development challenges.

Development cooperation can take the form of:

- **bilateral assistance**—aimed directly at individual partner countries in the form of assistance projects and programmes, loans and credits (e.g. tied aid loans) to implement specific initiatives, reduce debt, and fund scholarships for citizens of beneficiary countries;
- **multilateral assistance**—provided through contributions to international institutions that support development or provide humanitarian aid (such as specialised UN agencies).

Development cooperation is an important component of Polish foreign policy and a token of Poland's solidarity with developing countries. It complies with EU and global development strategies and fulfils the commitments arising from our membership of international organisations. It also supports the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in the resolution "Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development." By adopting this

document, UN member states committed themselves to working to improve life and well-being around the world, including:

- reducing poverty in all its forms;
- ensuring access to education, food and clean water;
- equalising opportunities for states and social groups;
- respecting human rights;
- maintaining global peace and stability;
- protecting the environment;
- mitigating climate change;
- improving access to sustainable energy sources.


Polish Aid is the name of a development cooperation programme coordinated by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It is implemented in cooperation with other public administration bodies, non-governmental organisations, and local actors in partner countries. All initiatives under the programme are marked with the distinctive Polish Aid logo.

## 2.2. Polish development cooperation: legal and institutional framework

Polish development cooperation is governed by the Development Cooperation Act of 16 September 2011 (Journal of Laws of 2021, item 1425) and coordinated by the Minister of Foreign Affairs through the National Coordinator for International Development Cooperation. Under the Act, the Development Cooperation Programme Council, an advisory and consultative body, operates at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Polish development cooperation is implemented under two kinds of documents. **Strategic documents**, like the current Multiannual Development Cooperation Programme for 2021-2030 “Solidarity for Development,” adopted in 2021 under a resolution of the Council of Ministers, set goals, thematic and geographical priorities, as well as directions of assistance operations. **Operational documents**, in the form of annual development cooperation plans, provide for principles, forms, and instruments of development cooperation.

The MFA’s Department of Development Cooperation (DDC) coordinates and implements development activities. It prepares programme guidelines as well as implementing and coordinating assistance activities.

Many institutions are engaged in the implementation of Polish development cooperation. These include other government administration agencies besides the MFA, local government units, non-governmental organisations, institutions of higher education, and Polish diplomatic missions in developing countries.

Each of these partners brings its own expertise and experience, enabling Polish Aid to respond to the diverse needs of developing countries.

The following are examples of public administration institutions implementing Polish development cooperation activities:

- **Ministry of Science and Higher Education (MSHE)** runs scholarship programmes for students from developing countries;
- **Ministry of the Interior and Administration (MIA)** offers expert support to partner countries in the area of public safety, including the development and capacity building of emergency response services, border protection, and road safety improvement;
- **Ministry of Development Funds and Regional Policy (MDFRP)** helps develop institutional capacities of administration in Moldova and Ukraine;
- **Office of Competition and Consumer Protection (UOKiK)** helps develop consumer protection systems and antitrust institutions in partner countries.


Polish development cooperation also covers cooperation with international organisations such as the European Union, United Nations, and Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). This cooperation helps shape global standards for aid and supports international initiatives, which, in turn, boosts impact and effectiveness of the activities.

Funds transferred by donor countries to developing countries—to support their economic and social growth—and to international organisations providing development assistance or humanitarian aid are classified as official development assistance (ODA). In 2024, the value of Polish ODA amounted to **PLN 7.326 billion**, of which **PLN 2.808 billion** (approx. 38%) was bilateral aid and **PLN 4.518 billion** was multilateral aid. In total, ODA amounted to **0.21% of gross national income**.

## 2.3. Geographic and thematic priorities of Polish development cooperation

In 2024, Poland continued its development activities focused on its priority developing countries. These include:

- **four Eastern Partnership countries:** Ukraine, Georgia<sup>1</sup>, Moldova, and Belarus (in the case of Belarus, the support concerned its civil society);
- **two Middle East countries:** Lebanon and Palestine;
- **four countries of Sub-Saharan Africa:** Ethiopia, Kenya, Senegal, and Tanzania.


In line with the thematic priorities set out in the Multiannual Development Cooperation Programme 2021–2023, measures supporting the implementation of selected sustainable development goals were put in place:



<sup>1</sup> 2024 was the last year of full implementation of the development cooperation. In 2025, following Georgian authorities' decision to freeze the EU integration process and in light of increasingly frequent human rights violations, development cooperation with the Georgian central administration has been discontinued.

The initiatives also took into account the cross-cutting priorities of Polish development cooperation, namely **climate protection** and **equal opportunities for women and men**. Projects carried out in 2024 promoted sustainable management of natural resources and biodiversity conservation, and counteracted discrimination and harmful stereotypes.

## Humanitarian aid in 2024

Since 24 February 2022, millions of civilians have been suffering the consequences of the Russian Federation's military actions in Ukraine, which is why Ukraine remained a priority country for Polish Aid in 2024.

At the same time, Poland actively responded to humanitarian crises in the Middle East. Aid was delivered also to the priority countries in the region: Lebanon and Palestine, particularly the Gaza Strip, and in response to the refugee crisis caused by the war in Syria.

In view of Africa's growing humanitarian needs, support was also provided to Sudan, which is affected by an escalating humanitarian crisis.

The MFA's main partners in delivering humanitarian aid were UN agencies and programmes, and the International Committee of the Red Cross. The largest voluntary contributions were transferred through the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UN OCHA), United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), and the World Food Programme (WFP).

Poland also supported pooled funds, which enable immediate humanitarian aid to be provided in various parts of the world in the event of so-called forgotten crises. In 2024, Poland donated **PLN 5.6 million to the United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF)**.

## Poland's humanitarian aid for Ukraine

In 2024, Poland transferred a total of **PLN 25 million** to meet Ukraine's humanitarian needs. The aid primarily concerned support for internally displaced persons (IDPs), residents of eastern and southern regions of Ukraine, the situation of children and women, and mine clearance initiatives

## Humanitarian aid in the Gaza Strip

Due to the dramatic deterioration of the humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip, Poland substantially increased its support. In 2024, more than **PLN 20 million** was spent from the MFA budget to aid Palestinians. Assistance was provided by means of contributions to UN specialised agencies (including the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, or UNWRA, and the WFP), as well as through **2 humanitarian projects (PLN 1.5 million each)** implemented by **Caritas Poland** and **Polish Humanitarian Action** in the Gaza Strip, under which medical equipment, food parcels, and cash support were delivered. Additionally, Egyptian hospitals treating patients from the Gaza Strip received specialist medical equipment thanks to the second tranche of Polish material aid (the first tranche was supplied in 2023).

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# Bilateral development cooperation in 2024

Bilateral cooperation is one of the main pillars of Polish development policy. It covers development and humanitarian activities undertaken directly for the benefit of partner countries, primarily in the form of projects implemented by Polish non-governmental organisations, central government bodies, local government units, and Polish diplomatic missions abroad.

In 2024, the cooperation focused on Polish Aid's priority countries: Ukraine, Georgia, Moldova, Belarus (as regards support for the country's civil society), Palestine, Lebanon, Ethiopia, Kenya, Senegal, and Tanzania. At the same time, assistance was directed to other developing countries included in the list of official development assistance recipients published by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's Development Assistance Committee (OECD DAC).





Development activities financed or co-financed by the MFA were carried out by a diverse group of entities and in various forms:

- projects implemented by government administration bodies;
- initiatives by Polish non-governmental organisations selected in the Polish Foreign Minister's calls for proposals;
- projects implemented by Polish diplomatic missions abroad in cooperation with local partners;
- activities carried out by Solidarity Fund PL (SF PL);
- training courses and programmes by the Eastern Partnership Academy of Public Administration (EPAPA);
- scholarship programmes for students from developing countries;
- bilateral assistance provided through international organisations in the form of so-called earmarked contributions.

The diversity of these forms makes it possible to tailor activities to the needs of foreign partners, at the same time allowing for the use of the competences and experience of various Polish institutions and civil society organisations.

## 4.1. Calls for proposals announced by the Minister of Foreign Affairs

Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland announces open calls for proposals to select development and humanitarian aid projects for partner countries, as well as global education initiatives aimed at Polish society.

The calls for proposals are held in line with regulations specifying the objectives, financing, deadlines, rules of procedure, and criteria for evaluating proposals. Proposals may be submitted by Polish non-governmental organisations, local government units, as well as public and non-public higher education institutions, among others. Each project must be implemented in collaboration with a local partner specified in the proposal.

Projects may last one year (**single-module**), in which case they must be completed by the end of the year in which the call for proposal was announced, or they may consist of **two or three separate modules** to be implemented over two or three years, respectively.

The following calls for proposals were announced in 2024:

- **“Polish Assistance 2024,”** which selected the best offers of development assistance and humanitarian aid. Co-financing was granted to **48 projects** carried out in: Ukraine (16), Moldova (3), Georgia (6), Palestine (3), Lebanon (3), Ethiopia (3), Kenya (4), Senegal (3), and Tanzania (7);
- **“Global Education 2024,”** which provided co-financing for **9 educational projects** run in Poland.

## 4.2. Projects implemented by Polish government administration bodies

Polish government institutions play a significant role in achieving development cooperation goals in priority countries. The projects they implement support political reforms, the modernisation of state structures, and the development of crisis response systems. They are financed with both Polish Aid funds and the EU budget.

In 2024, the Ministry of the Interior and Administration, the Armed Forces Operational Command, the Ministry of Development Funds and Regional Policy, and the Office of Competition and Consumer Protection implemented a total of **32 projects** worth approximately **PLN 11.662 million**. Five countries benefitted from these activities: Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, Lebanon, and Kenya.

In **Ukraine**, the projects focused on strengthening the administration in the area of regional policy-making, developing entrepreneurship and competitiveness, as well as expanding the education system and training infrastructure for emergency services and safety education. In the context of the ongoing war in Ukraine, Poland also supported mine clearance and pyrotechnic training for police officers and the documentation of war damage for use in law enforcement proceedings. At the same time, Polish government authorities supported institutions preparing Ukraine and Moldova for membership of the European Union.

In **Moldova** emphasis was put on building professional public institutions at both central and local levels, with particular focus on the development of the competition protection system and the management of European funds.

Efforts were also taken to increase the capacity of the search and rescue group and anti-corruption services.

In **Georgia**, the measures taken focused on improving road safety, developing specialist rescue services, and building an ICT system for crisis management.

In **Lebanon**, the projects aimed at improving water and energy management as well as upgrading medical infrastructure.

In **Kenya**, the development consumer protection system was supported.

## 4.3. Eastern Partnership Academy of Public Administration

The Eastern Partnership Academy of Public Administration (EPAPA) is a National School of Public Administration (NSPA) programme commissioned by the MFA. It is intended to strengthen the Eastern Partnership countries' public administrations by means of specialised training courses for their officials.

The **14th edition** took place in 2024 and comprised three training modules. The first one was a two-week apprenticeship for public officials from five Eastern Partnership countries (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova, and Ukraine) organised in cooperation with the Civil Service Department of the Chancellery of the Prime Minister.

Next two modules, intended for civil servants from Moldova and Ukraine, combined lectures and workshops run by experienced experts and practitioners. A training in the development of digital services and citizen services in tax administration was prepared in cooperation with the National Revenue Administration and the Ministry of Finance. A training course on the role of domestic parliaments in the European integration process was in turn devised in cooperation with the Chancellery of the Polish Sejm.

The EPAPA's 14th edition was attended by a total of **46 students**.

## 4.4. Scholarship programmes

Access to quality education drives the sustainable development of countries and societies. Polish universities offer foreign students the opportunity to acquire knowledge and skills that are often unavailable in their countries of origin. During their studies, they also learn about Polish history, culture, and language. The experience and contacts they gain in Poland may help them in the future to take on important roles in the political, economic, and social life of their countries.

Students from developing countries can apply for exemption from tuition fees at Polish universities and for scholarships co-financed, among others, from development cooperation funds. The Ministry of Science and Higher Education, the National Agency for Academic Exchange, and universities play a key role in promoting academic exchange and the internationalisation of Polish education system.

### **Stefan Banach Scholarship Programme**

The Stefan Banach Scholarship Programme supports the socio-economic growth of selected developing countries by improving the education and professional qualifications of their citizens. It enables students to undertake free master's studies (2nd cycle) at public universities supervised by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education.

In 2024, students from the following **46 countries** were eligible for the programme: Albania, Angola, Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Colombia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Georgia, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kosovo, Lebanon, Mexico, Moldova, Mongolia, Montenegro, Nepal, Nigeria, North Macedonia, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Peru, the Philippines, Rwanda, Senegal, Serbia, Tanzania, Tunisia, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam, Yemen, and Zambia.

NAWA is responsible for organising student recruitment, and studies conducted in Polish may be preceded by a one-year preparatory course offered on a scholarship basis. **More than 600 foreign students** took part in the programme in 2024.

### **The Konstanty Kalinowski Scholarship Programme “Solidarity with Belarus”**


In 2024, support was also continued under the Konstanty Kalinowski Scholarship Programme, aimed at students and researchers from Belarus who were forced to emigrate for political reasons. The programme offered assistance in the form of, e.g., scholarships, free studies, and preparatory courses to enable them to enrol at Polish universities.

Assistance was provided to **over 500 beneficiaries**, who got the opportunity to study and work at Polish universities and enjoy all the freedoms available to the academic community in Poland. The programme has been continuously run since 2006 by the Warsaw University’s Department of Eastern Studies.

## 4.5. Development cooperation in Polish Aid priority countries

ODA in 2024—Eastern Partnership countries (in PLN million)




#### Ukraine

##### Scope of measures and number of projects

In 2024, **a total of 51 projects** were implemented for Ukraine. Among them, 14 were implemented by the government administration, 2 by local government units, 10 by the Polish Embassy in Kyiv and Polish consulates general in Ukraine, 16 by non-governmental organisations, and 9 by the Solidarity Fund PL. The activities financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 2024 were aimed at supporting both the functioning of Ukrainian institutions in wartime conditions and the reconstruction and modernisation of the state, as well as providing the most urgent humanitarian aid.

### Enhancement of crisis management system

One of the key areas of development assistance was the expansion of national and local crisis management systems and increasing operational capacity of emergency response services. Poland mainly cooperated with **the State Emergency Service of Ukraine (DSNS)**.

In 2024, Polish Aid funds were allocated to the training of **more than 600 DSNS rescuers** in the oblasts of Kherson, Odesa, Ivano-Frankivsk, Khmelnytskyi, Ternopil, and Kyiv.

The rescuers were also provided with **specialist equipment**. The development of a network of the **Regional Rescue Training Centres** was also concluded. Modern training facilities for the fire service and sappers were set up in Lviv, Vinnytsia, and Cherkasy.

The development of **volunteer fire brigades** in Ukraine, especially in the oblasts of Chernivtsi and Volhynia, was also continued by the Solidarity Fund PL. Simultaneously, MFA donated **PLN 2.5 million to the UNDP**. The donation was used to buy the MinesEye system to detect mines and unexploded bombs by means of drones and to survey **400 hectares** of minefields.

### **Contribution to reconstruction and regional development**

Poland is already actively supporting efforts to reconstruct Ukraine. The projects implemented by the public administration concerned, among other things, assistance in shaping regional policy, implementing the Ukraine Facility Plan in the area of regional development, developing Comprehensive Recovery Programmes, and enhancing the competitiveness of Ukraine's regions.

Assistance for Ukraine in the reconstruction process is closely linked to investments in human capital. Solidarity Fund implemented the Skills4Recovery project, co-financed by the EU and supporting the development of the Ukrainian education and vocational training system. The Polish contribution to Skills4Recovery amounted to nearly PLN 1.2 million.

In response to the heavy damage sustained by the health care sector and the most urgent needs of the population, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs financed projects by Polish non-governmental organisations, thanks to which **over 40 medical and social assistance facilities and centres** were reconstructed or equipped, including hospitals, local assistance centres, and mobile medical teams. Special attention was paid to psychological assistance.

In 2024, **1,200 people**—doctors, therapists of various specialisations, and carers—participated in medical assistance courses, including on mental health. **11,300 individuals** received direct psychological support.

### **Support for veterans and displaced persons**

Supporting veterans and their families is an important part of Polish development cooperation with Ukraine. Polish Aid projects for them have been implemented by the Solidarity Fund, which has established **Psychosocial Support Centres for Veterans in the Rivne oblast**. These centres offer psychological, social, legal, and professional assistance within local governments, aimed not only at veterans and their families, but also at residents of hromadas<sup>2</sup> and internally displaced persons.

## **Georgia**

### **Scope of measures and number of projects**

In 2024, **a total of 25 projects** were implemented in Georgia, including: 9 implemented by non-governmental organisations, 5 by the Polish Embassy in Tbilisi, 5 by the government administration bodies, 1 by a local government (the Tarczyn municipality), and 5 by the Solidarity Fund PL.


Polish development cooperation in this country focused on supporting socio-economic development, with particular emphasis on vulnerable groups such as people with disabilities and victims of domestic violence. The projects aimed to improve the quality of life of marginalised people, facilitate their access to social services, integrate them into society, and promote their professional activation. An important element was to increase the availability and quality of diagnostic and rehabilitation services—both for children and adults with

disabilities—by training specialists in health diagnostics, physiotherapy, and rehabilitation.

### Education, economy, emergency response services, energy

Poland continued its long-standing support for the expansion of Georgia's early childhood education system. The activities focused on improving the quality of education in areas inhabited by national minorities, where the risk of educational exclusion is particularly high.

Other projects served to develop and promote the economy of Georgia's selected regions, including the development of tourism, by attracting investment and supporting local entrepreneurship.

The development of the rescue system also continued and included setting up a training system for fire-fighters, improving qualifications of emergency response services, and the development of a chain of emergency posts to increase the security of civilians in natural and man-made disasters.

Additionally, the Solidarity Fund PL launched initiatives to improve energy efficiency in local governments, promoting the use of renewable energy sources and the implementation of environmentally friendly solutions.


## Moldova

### Scope of measures and number of projects

A total of **29 projects** were implemented in Moldova in 2024 as part of Polish Aid by: the government administration bodies (8), local government units (3), the Polish Embassy in Chişinău (8), non-governmental organisations (5), and the Solidarity Fund PL (5).

Their activity mainly focused on strengthening crisis management systems (projects aimed at security and rescue services), supporting entrepreneurship, and reviving urban and rural areas.

### Strengthening institutions and management systems

In the area of crisis management, at both central and local levels, projects were implemented contributing to the development of a search and rescue team, road rescue and social prevention, as well as combating drug crime and corruption. For many years, the MDFRP has been supporting Moldova's public administration in its EU integration process including by developing European funds management systems and reviving rural areas. The UOKiK, in turn, continued initiatives to strengthen the competition protection system and antitrust institutions.

## Developing rural areas and tourism

Non-governmental organisations, the Polish Embassy, and local government units also implemented projects supporting the development of entrepreneurship and tourism in rural areas. Their aim was to mitigate the depopulation of rural areas, among other things by supporting women’s entrepreneurship, improving local infrastructure and living conditions, and promoting sustainable tourism.

As part of the projects implemented, support was provided to a number of businesses run by women outside the Chişinău agglomeration, the sports hall in the village of Raşcov was thoroughly renovated, and the health centre in the village of Mileşti was refurbished. The Solidarity Fund PL, on the other hand, continued to implement **the LEADER programme**, which has set up a legal framework for the activities of local groups and the financing of their initiatives from the National Fund for Agriculture and Rural Development.

## Supporting civil society in Belarus


In 2024, due to a difficult political situation in Belarus and the lack of respect for civil liberties and human rights, Poland continued to support Belarusian civil society. Activities focused on two areas: “**Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions**” and “**Equal Opportunity – Education.**”

**In total, several dozen projects were carried out**, targeting victims of repression, independent media and journalists, as well as students and academics from Belarus.


The funds were allocated, among other purposes, to cover the costs of education and scholarships for Belarusian students continuing their studies at Polish universities.

An important element of the assistance activities was cooperation with organisations and social activists via the Solidarity Fund PL. The cooperation included measures to ensure observance of human rights and democratic principles, ensure access to reliable information, and build civil society.

#### 4.5.2. Other priority countries—the Middle East

In 2024, Polish Aid initiatives in the Middle East were undertaken in the context of the ongoing war in the Gaza Strip and the escalation of the conflict between Hezbollah and Israel, including military operations in southern Lebanon. Thanks to the involvement of Polish NGOs and their local partners, as well as active support from Polish diplomatic missions in Beirut and Ramallah, most of the activities planned for Polish Aid priority countries in the region were successfully implemented.


The initiatives carried out in Lebanon were Poland's response to the economic crisis that has gripped the country since 2019, as well as to the challenges facing local authorities in introducing necessary reforms and coping with the effects of migration from Syria triggered by the civil war of 2011.

#### Palestine

##### Scope of measures and number of projects

In 2024, **6 development projects** and **2 humanitarian projects** were implemented in Palestine by Polish non-governmental organisations and funded by Polish Aid. Additionally, **5 initiatives** were carried out by the Representative Office of the Republic of Poland in Ramallah.

### Supporting health care and social integration in the West Bank

Development projects implemented in the West Bank by NGOs focused on improving the quality and accessibility of health care for the most vulnerable social groups and on improving the living conditions of people with disabilities. The activities included medical consultations delivered by mobile teams, preventive health screenings, psychosocial support, and the purchase of medicines and medical equipment.

Cooperation with the Palestinian Ministry of Health enabled the modernisation of health centres and the retrofitting of the Palestinian Medical Association's mobile clinics, which improved the quality of services offered. This allowed almost **10,500 medical consultations** to be provided in the Hebron and Jenin districts.

In conditions of limited access to traditional facilities, the projects also contributed to the development of a **telemedicine** system, which becomes another tool for providing medical care to the inhabitants of Palestine in situations of security threats. Community-based rehabilitation centres were also modernised, particularly those located in areas distant from major urban centres, and were equipped with specialist therapeutic devices.

Poland's assistance further supported initiatives promoting entrepreneurship and professional activation among persons with disabilities and their families, as well as among women and young people. In total, **40 beneficiaries** received training in establishing and managing their own businesses and were provided with financial support to launch them.


In response to the humanitarian crisis in the Gaza Strip, numerous **health and food security** initiatives were undertaken. Palestinian families received **3,340** food parcels containing supplies tailored to the cultural preferences and needs of the region's residents. In total, more than **17,000 Palestinians** benefited from food assistance.

Under another project, **1,000 families** received cash assistance (multipurpose cash grant), which enabled them to meet their most urgent needs, including food. In addition, **2,800** patients were provided with at least one medical consultation, while **2,300** received essential medicines.

**Scope of measures and number of projects**

In 2024, **5 development projects** by Polish non-governmental organisations and **5 initiatives** of the Armed Forces Operational Command were implemented in Lebanon. In addition, the Polish Embassy in Beirut launched **6 projects**. Priority was given to building the capacity of local administration, strengthening the operational capabilities of emergency rescue and civil defence services in responding to natural disasters, improving the quality of water and road infrastructure, developing education and entrepreneurship as well as promoting climate protection efforts—primarily through sustainable waste management and the use of renewable energy sources.

## Infrastructure and crisis management

Assistance measures contributed to improving the quality of damaged water infrastructure—whose condition posed a threat to continuous operations—by clearing more than **3 km of a riverbed** and building **nearly 1.7 km of irrigation channels**, as well as to repairing road infrastructure. At the same time, initiatives were undertaken to strengthen local crisis management capacities. Representatives of **26 municipalities** received training, which improved their preparedness for natural disasters.

Another project focused on enhancing the skills of services responsible for emergency response management in crisis situations, firefighting, and search-and-rescue operations. Its main beneficiaries—namely **the Lebanese Red Cross, the Lebanese Civil Defense, and the Beirut Fire Brigade**—received specialist equipment for search-and-rescue operations. Additionally, the project included workshops for key command personnel and emergency response training sessions. The trainees and users of the provided equipment were directly involved in delivering assistance to the civilian population during armed hostilities in southern Lebanon.

## Education, entrepreneurship, and local development

Development projects also supported the professional activation of residents in rural areas at risk of unemployment and the growth of local entrepreneurship.

To this end, the tourism potential of central and northern Lebanon (including Batroun, Chouf, and Jbeil) was utilised, and a training programme was implemented focusing, among other areas, on information technologies and social media management.

At the same time, Polish Aid activities enabled the development of the education system and entrepreneurship among the most vulnerable communities in Beirut and other locations. More than **2,500 participants** took part in workshops, courses, and training sessions, of which **70%** were **women** and **over 5%** were **persons with disabilities**. The programme enabled them to acquire professional skills in fields such as robotics, 3D printing, solar energy technologies, administration, and photography, increasing participants' chances of finding employment and achieving economic self-reliance.

### **Environment and climate protection**

As part of another project, a municipal waste-collection system and river-clearing programme were implemented in several districts of central and northern Lebanon (e.g., Bekaa, Keserwan, Tripoli), benefiting **around 5,000 households**—home to **nearly 30,000 people**. A public awareness campaign was also organised to educate communities on environmental protection, with particular emphasis on waste segregation and recycling.

### **Operations of the Polish Military Contingent as part of UNIFIL**

An important aspect of Poland's assistance in Lebanon involved the activities pursued by **the Polish Military Contingent** participating in **the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL)**. The projects implemented by the contingent's Civil-Military Co-operation (CIMIC) team supported the peacekeeping and security-enhancement efforts in **5 municipalities** covered by the mission's mandate in southern Lebanon. The initiatives included enabling the generation of energy from renewable sources, purchasing firefighting equipment, and supporting the development of the local health care system.

### **4.5.3. Other priority countries—Sub-Saharan Africa**


Polish Aid activities in Sub-Saharan Africa target **four priority countries**: Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia, and Senegal. In 2024, Polish NGOs continued their actions as part of projects co-financed under **the “Polish Development Assistance 2023”** call for proposals as well as implementing new initiatives awarded under **the “Polish Assistance 2024”** call for proposals.

## Scope of measures and number of projects

Senegal has been a Polish Aid priority country since 2016. Support is provided mainly through co-financing projects carried out by Polish NGOs selected in calls for proposals, as well as through initiatives of Polish diplomatic missions implemented in cooperation with local partners. In addition, Senegalese students can benefit from the Stefan Banach Scholarship Programme.

In 2024, NGOs implemented **3 initiatives** and the Polish Embassy in Dakar **5 projects**.

## Health and nutrition

Activities carried out under Polish Aid 2024 projects focused on health care and improving the quality of education. Health centres were built, modernised,

and equipped, with particular emphasis on **maternity and childbirth care**, as well as **combating malnutrition**.

Training was conducted in prenatal diagnostics, delivery techniques, medical treatment, and the operation of medical equipment, aimed at reducing pregnancy- and childbirth-related complications, including lowering maternal and neonatal mortality. Project activities also sought to improve the quality of nutrition for children under the age of five and to ensure better hospitalisation conditions for the youngest patients suffering from severe malnutrition. The purchased project equipment and trained personnel will enable the provision of services both at stationary health centres and in mobile form.

## Education

In the city of Thiès, located in western Senegal, a new educational facility has been built to help the region's children and young people access education. Thanks to the next phase of the project implemented in 2025, the school will be fully adapted to accommodate **400 children aged 10 to 16**.


The facility will also offer extracurricular activities such as tutoring, remedial classes, and sports. These opportunities will also be available to children and adolescents who are not enrolled in the school.

# Tanzania

## Scope of measures and number of projects

Tanzania is Poland’s key partner in East Africa and, since 2007, has remained one of the major African beneficiaries of Polish bilateral development assistance. In 2024, NGOs implemented a total of **10 projects** for the benefit of Tanzania, while the Polish Embassy in Dar es Salaam carried out **4 initiatives**.

## Support for the health sector and emergency medicine

Development activities focused on strengthening the health sector and supporting emergency medicine, a relatively new vocational field in Tanzania as the first graduates completed their studies only in 2013. As part of Polish Aid projects, **900 hospital staff** were trained in 10 different areas of emergency medicine, including cardiology, paediatrics, obstetrics, and neonatology. Additionally, emergency service officers participated in courses on providing first aid at accident sites.

## Developing entrepreneurship and modern dairy farming

Entrepreneurship was another area of focus for development activities. Thanks to Polish Aid projects, support was provided to farmers from the Kilimanjaro region. The aim of these initiatives was to create opportunities for people to overcome poverty through dignified, independent work, and the development of rural communities, with particular emphasis on young people. In 2024, cooperation began between a local dairy processing plant and an agricultural vocational school to promote practical knowledge about modern dairy farming and thus increase the scale of milk production in the region.

As part of the projects, a model **dairy cattle farm** was established, **an irrigation system** was built, **more than 5 hectares of fields** were sown with high-value fodder crops, and **feed production machinery** was purchased. The project was supplemented with educational activities for farmers, including local training sessions and study visits to farms in neighbouring Kenya.


Polish Aid also supported vocational education, including through the renovation of classrooms and the purchase of new equipment for the Don Bosco KIITEC Higher Technical School in Arusha. The aim of the project was to improve the level of vocational training in computer science, electrical engineering, automation, electronics, and telecommunications, as well as enabling a greater number of KIITEC students to study and access the latest technologies.

This will also help increase the employment opportunities of young people from disadvantaged backgrounds.

### Scope of measures and number of projects

Kenya has been one of the main African beneficiaries of Polish bilateral development assistance since 2004. In 2024, Polish NGOs carried out **4 projects** in this country, **1 project** was implemented by a government administration body, and **4 initiatives** were carried out by the Polish Embassy in Nairobi.

### Supporting emergency response services and public safety

One of the key areas was health care and developing the capabilities of Kenya’s emergency response services. Poland has cooperated in this field for over a decade, training and equipping fire service and emergency response services.

In 2024, **the Kiambu Fire and Rescue Training Centre** was established, the first facility of that type in Kenya and the entire Horn of Africa. Its mission

is to provide high-quality vocational education and certification to firefighters from across the country. So far, Polish instructors have trained **more than 60% of Kenya's firefighters**.

The training covered rescue operations, first aid, water and rope rescue, organisation of response actions in the event of road accidents, handling hazardous materials, as well as courses for future training staff. The Centre was provided with modern rescue and professional personal protective equipment. Training activities and equipment support also continued for **the Building Collapse Search and Rescue Team in the Nairobi Metropolitan Area**.


As part of Polish Aid, an initiative was also carried out for survivors of human trafficking, aimed at ensuring their equal professional opportunities and strengthening their economic independence. The majority of project participants were women (53 out of 60 participants). The programme included training sessions to develop skills needed to run businesses: from the basics of entrepreneurship and knowledge of Kenyan labour law to marketing, finance, and the principles of sustainable water resource management.

Participants developed strategies for growing and strengthening the businesses they managed. Grants were awarded for the implementation of **50 prepared business plans**, enabling the beneficiaries to expand their enterprises and improve their financial standing.

## Scope of measures and number of projects

Ethiopia has been a priority country for Polish development assistance since 2004. The country receives bilateral assistance through the activities pursued by the Polish Embassy in Addis Ababa and as part of MFA-financed projects that are implemented by Polish NGOs. In 2024, NGOs implemented **3 initiatives**, while the Polish Embassy in Addis Ababa carried out **3 projects**.

## Developing emergency response and crisis management services

As part of the Polish Assistance 2024 call for proposals, special emphasis was placed on developing emergency response and crisis management services in Addis Ababa. **Training sessions** were conducted **for fire-service instructors**, and **fire-fighting units were equipped with specialist gear**. The new tools will enable rescue operations after dark, in smoke-filled rooms, and in tunnels, as well as the release of people trapped in elevators.

### **Vocational education for youth**

The development projects also included improving access to vocational education for children and young people, especially girls and young women from socially marginalised backgrounds. **Infrastructure** was created **that enables the delivery of vocational courses, the expansion of their offers, and an improvement in their quality.** As a result, more vulnerable students—particularly girls and persons with disabilities—will be able to take part in vocational training, receiving the opportunity to acquire practical skills and improve employment prospects.

## **4.6. Projects implemented through Polish missions abroad**

Polish missions abroad implement development projects both in Polish Aid priority countries and in other developing states. In 2024, **117 projects** with a total value of approximately **PLN 7.542 million** were carried out. These initiatives responded to the needs of local communities and were implemented in collaboration with local partners, such as non-governmental organisations, religious institutions, public service providers, and both local and central government administration.

## Eastern Partnership, South Caucasus, and Central Asia

In Eastern Partnership priority countries—Georgia, Moldova, and Ukraine—**23 projects** were carried out. **5 initiatives** were also implemented in Armenia. Additionally, **1 project** was completed in Uzbekistan and **1** in Tajikistan.

These activities included increasing access to social services—among others for persons with disabilities—by improving medical infrastructure and access to rehabilitation. Particular emphasis was placed on supporting the treatment, rehabilitation, and reintegration of war veterans in Ukraine, as well as on medical aid and emergency response training. Projects were also implemented to improve the quality and conditions of teaching at educational institutions through upgrading infrastructure—including sports infrastructure—and the purchase of equipment and teaching materials.

Investments were made in the renovation of urban and rural infrastructure. In regions distant from major cities, efforts focused on developing municipal services, especially expanding the water supply network, as well as implementing energy-efficient solutions in public utility buildings.

## Sub-Saharan Africa, the Western Balkans, Asia and the Pacific, Latin America, and the Caribbean

In the priority countries of Sub-Saharan Africa—Ethiopia, Kenya, Senegal, and Tanzania—Polish diplomatic missions implemented a total of **16 projects** in 2024. Additionally, **10 projects** were carried out in Zambia, Madagascar,

and Côte d'Ivoire. In 6 Western Balkan states—Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Kosovo, North Macedonia, and Serbia—Polish missions implemented **17 development projects**. In Asia and Oceania countries—Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Timor-Leste, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, and the Philippines—**14 initiatives** were implemented. In Cuba and in South American countries—Argentina, Colombia, and Venezuela—**7 projects** were completed.

Activities in these regions included, among other things, the construction and modernisation of medical and sanitary infrastructure, equipping medical facilities with diagnostic equipment, and developing specialist health care with particular emphasis on maternal and child care as well as on the needs of persons with disabilities. Support was also provided to fire and emergency services. In the field of education, projects were implemented to expand infrastructure and systems, promote equal educational opportunities for girls, young women, and people from groups at risk of exclusion (including persons with disabilities, internally displaced persons, and refugees), develop vocational education and entrepreneurship, and create new jobs. Efforts focused on improving agricultural skills related to farming, cultivation, as well as food storage and processing. Support was provided for sustainable food production and food security, including strengthening the resilience of local communities to negative impacts of climate change. Projects were also implemented to improve energy efficiency, disseminate modern food-production technologies, preserve biodiversity, and help residents adapt to changing environmental conditions.

## The Middle East and North Africa

In Polish Aid priority countries across the Middle East: Palestine and Lebanon, a total of **11 projects** were carried out. The activities of the Representative Office of the Republic of Poland in Ramallah included the modernisation of medical infrastructure, the organisation of a health campaign, providing a school with computer equipment, as well as the distribution of food and financial aid as well as essential items for the poorest residents of Bethlehem. The Polish Embassy in Beirut implemented projects supporting education and the health care system by equipping classrooms and a laboratory, as well as installing solar and lighting systems. These projects will benefit more than **10,000 people annually**, including nearly **1,500 students and children of Syrian refugees**.

In the remaining countries of the Middle East and North Africa—Jordan, Syria, Iran, Iraq, Tunisia, Egypt, as well as Chad<sup>3</sup>—Polish missions abroad implemented **12 development and humanitarian projects** financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. These activities, carried out in cooperation with experienced local partners, were aimed primarily at supporting and developing educational institutions and the health sector. Their beneficiaries included marginalised communities, such as low-income families, persons with disabilities, and refugees. The projects covered, among other things, the electrification of medical facilities and schools, education in ecology and breast cancer treatment, mobile nursing care, support for centres for persons with disabilities, food assistance for poor families, single mothers, and unemployed individuals, support for the education of Afghan refugees in Iran, and the provision of medical services in the Hasansham U3 camp, inhabited by internally displaced persons.

## Multilateral development cooperation in 2024

In 2024, Poland actively participated in the work of international organisations dedicated to development cooperation, mainly the European Union, the Development Assistance Committee of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD DAC), and the United Nations. Through its active engagement in these bodies, Poland promoted the priorities of its foreign policy and sought to ensure their inclusion in the organisations' activities.

Poland made efforts to maintain strong support for Ukraine as well as enhancing food security, responding to growing needs in the humanitarian aid sector, and placing greater emphasis on strengthening the resilience of states and societies in response to crises.

Poland's activity within the European Union focused, especially in the second half of 2024, on preparations for assuming the presidency of the Council of the European Union, scheduled for the first half of 2025.

At the United Nations, Poland actively participated in the work to prepare the organisational and substantive framework for the Fourth International Conference on Financing for Development held in Seville from 30 June to 3 July 2025.

## 5.1. Cooperation under EU development policy

In 2024, Poland actively participated in the work of EU institutions involved in broadly understood development cooperation. Activities were undertaken primarily within the EU Council and its preparatory bodies:

- **the Working Party on Development Cooperation and International Partnership (CODEV-PI);**
- **the African, Caribbean and Pacific Working Party (ACP);**
- **the Council Working Party on Humanitarian Aid and Food Aid (COHAFA).**

During ministerial meetings—mainly the Foreign Affairs Council in the development ministers’ format (FAC DEV)—Poland consistently raised issues that are key from the perspective of its development policy. These included the demand for prioritising EU neighbourhood policy countries in EU development assistance, as well as addressing Ukraine’s development and humanitarian needs.

Within the ACP Working Party, the Polish delegation actively participated in the work related to the implementation of **the Samoa Agreement**. Poland ratified this document on 22 October 2024, becoming the fourth EU Member State (after Estonia, Denmark, and Slovenia) to do so.

In 2024, Poland was also involved in shaping decisions concerning the directions of EU support under **the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument—Global Europe (NDICI-GE)**. Polish representatives took part in the work of the NDICI-GE Committee in its formats on Sub-Saharan Africa, Asia and the Pacific, the Americas and the Caribbean, Global Challenges, as well as the Operational Board of the European Fund for Sustainable Development Plus (EFSD+).

One of the most important areas of Poland’s activity at the EU involved **preparations to assume the Presidency of the Council of the EU** in the first half of 2025. Accordingly, the main objectives and priorities of the Polish Presidency in the area of development cooperation were prepared, including for the ACP, CODEV-PI, and COHAFA working groups.

Work also began on organising Presidency meetings in Warsaw and Brussels, including ministerial meetings (FAC DEV sessions) and the European Humanitarian Forum. Poland closely monitored the activities of the preceding

Presidencies—Belgium and Hungary—in the field of development cooperation and carried out consultations with these countries and with EU institutions to ensure the efficient substantive and organisational preparation of the Polish Presidency, taking into account challenges at the time and the global geopolitical situation.

## 5.2. Voluntary multilateral contributions

Poland makes annual voluntary contributions to international organisations that support the implementation of Poland’s foreign policy objectives, particularly in the area of international development cooperation. These contributions strengthen Poland’s global position and increase its influence on the activities of organisations working in areas such as sustainable development, conflict prevention, the protection and promotion of human rights, support for democratisation processes, as well as peacekeeping and post-conflict reconstruction.

In 2024, the Department of Development Cooperation provided voluntary contributions totalling **nearly PLN 218.69 million**. Additionally, Poland paid a mandatory contribution of **PLN 131.5 million to the European Development Fund (EDF)**.

**Ukraine** remained the priority direction of Poland’s support. The multidimensional assistance included actions aimed at strengthening critical infrastructure

and supporting Ukrainian entrepreneurs, including by enhancing the country's economic resilience and energy efficiency.

Poland also supported regions beyond its immediate eastern neighbourhood. A significant share of funds was allocated in response to the deteriorating humanitarian situation in the Middle East (in the Gaza Strip, Lebanon, and Syria).

## 5.3. Cooperation with international financial institutions

In 2024, Poland continued its cooperation with international development banks, primarily with the **European Investment Bank (EIB)** and the **European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD)**. This cooperation included both regular membership contributions and participation in trust funds operating, for example, to support Ukraine and Moldova.


In October 2024, Poland contributed **EUR 25 million** to an EIB fund supporting Ukraine. Established by the EIB in 2023 and currently valued at **nearly EUR 400 million**, the EU for Ukraine Fund (EU4U) is to help rebuild infrastructure, restore essential services, and stimulate economic growth in Ukraine.

The fund was established as part of **the EU for Ukraine Initiative** and its activities include support for Ukraine's critical public sector infrastructure (e.g. rebuilding bridges, hospitals, schools) and investments in economic recovery. EIB resources will also finance technical assistance and advisory

services for urgent needs, reconstruction efforts, and accession support for Ukraine, as well as resilience-building and the accession process for Moldova.

Poland also made a contribution to the **EBRD E5P Fund** (Eastern Europe Energy Efficiency and Environmental Partnership Fund), which supports energy efficiency improvements in Moldova, Georgia, Armenia, and Ukraine. This aligns with the priorities of Poland's development cooperation in both geographic and thematic contexts. The total amount contributed to the EBRD E5P Fund in 2024 stood at **PLN 7.44 million**.

## 5.4. Engaging the private sector to achieve the goals of development cooperation—the Polish Challenge Fund



### **POLISH** **CHALLENGE** **FUND**

In 2024, efforts continued to involve Polish enterprises in development initiatives through cooperation with **UNDP** under **the Polish Challenge Fund (PCF)** programme. Thanks to financial support provided by the PCF, Polish companies and research institutions were able to implement their innovative solutions in partner countries in areas such as green technologies, energy transition, digital innovations, and sustainable agriculture.

Activities under **the 6th edition** of the programme, carried out in 2024, focused on **Georgia** and **Moldova**.



## Global education

The goal of global education is to disseminate knowledge and develop skills necessary to understand the interdependencies and connections that exist in today's globalised world. In the face of current challenges—such as climate change, deepening socio-economic inequalities, rapid technological advances, intensified migration, and armed conflicts—global education helps to better understand these processes. It also fosters empathy, a sense of responsibility and solidarity as well as promoting attitudes that encourage action for a more just, sustainable, and secure world, one based on respect for other people, cultures, and the environment.

### Implementation of global education activities

In implementing global education, the MFA collaborates with entities selected through calls for proposals for the best educational projects. In 2024, **3 projects** chosen in the “**Global Education 2023**” call for proposals were continued, mainly targeting teachers, educators, and students of pedagogical fields. A “**Global Education 2024**” call for proposals was also held, resulting in funding for **9 projects** with a total value of **PLN 1.93 million**.

As part of global education projects, the MFA supported, among others: the HumanDOC International Documentary Film Festival, which addresses global issues; a regranting project, which provided funding for initiatives implemented in smaller towns (with populations under 500,000); and educational activities targeting teachers, school youth, and university students.

MFA representatives continued cross-sector dialogue on the implementation of global education in Poland. In addition to the MFA, the dialogue currently involves the Ministry of National Education, along with its Centre for Education Development, the Ministry of Science and Higher Education, the Ministry of Climate and Environment, the Ministry of Economic Development and Technology, as well as representatives of non-governmental organisations and the academic community.

# 7

## Evaluation and information activities

In 2024, an evaluation study of Polish development cooperation was conducted, covering Polish Aid activities **in Moldova** and their impact on achieving selected development goals of that country in 2021–2024. The assessment focused on the aid implementation model taking into account Moldova’s needs and Poland’s development specialisations.

Evaluation conclusions are primarily aimed at increasing the effectiveness of Polish Aid, particularly in planning and management.

In 2024, publicity activities about Polish Aid were carried out mainly using online tools: **the website** [www.gov.pl/polskapomoc](http://www.gov.pl/polskapomoc) and the **@polskapomoc profile on the social media platform X**. These channels published updates on ongoing development cooperation initiatives and information about grant calls for proposals announced by the Minister of Foreign Affairs. Another communication tool aimed at a broad audience were Polish Aid **podcasts**, presenting Polish development and humanitarian activities, available on the **Simplecast** platform and on the Polish Aid website [www.gov.pl/polskapomoc/podkasty](http://www.gov.pl/polskapomoc/podkasty).
