**RESOLUTION No. 32/2025
OF THE SCIENCE EVALUATION COMMITTEE
of 24 September 2025**

on the evaluation of the quality of education at a doctoral school

Pursuant to Article 259(1) and Article 262(2) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), hereinafter referred to as the "Act", having reviewed the results of the evaluation referred to in Article 262(1) of the Act, which was carried out by the Evaluation Team, the Science Evaluation Committee

positively evaluates the quality of education

at the Doctoral School of Physical Culture Sciences

run by

the Bronisław Czech University of Physical Culture in Kraków

(which, during the period evaluated, also operated as
the Bronisław Czech University of Physical Education in Kraków).

This evaluation applies to the period from 1 October 2019 to 18 December 2024.

Justification:

Based on an analysis of the self-assessment report and the site visit, it was concluded that the educational process at the Doctoral School of Physical Culture Sciences, run by the Bronisław Czech University of Physical Culture in Kraków, meets the criteria specified by law. The Doctoral School curriculum and individual research plans show formal compliance with the requirements of the Regulation of the Minister of Education and Science on the evaluation of the quality of doctoral school education (Journal of Laws of 2021, item 1847) and correspond to the characteristics of learning outcomes for qualifications at level 8 of the Polish Qualification Framework (PQF). The evaluated Doctoral School has implemented a number of mechanisms to verify the learning outcomes for qualifications at level 8 of the PQF and to ensure proper academic oversight and support in conducting research activities. The recruitment process complies with formal requirements in terms of its quality. The mid-term assessment procedure is carried out in a way that complies with the applicable legislation and is characterised by impartiality, transparency of criteria, objectivity and openness of proceedings. The Doctoral School has been undertaking certain measures to pursue internationalisation. However, these activities must be significantly strengthened and systematised. The cooperation between the Doctoral School and the doctoral students' council covers both formal and practical aspects related to the education process. Nonetheless, it needs to be more formalised. The effectiveness of doctoral education was assessed positively. The reservations contained in the Evaluation Report, concerning some of the procedures and solutions applied by the Doctoral School of Physical Culture Sciences run by the Bronisław Czech University of Physical Culture in Kraków, are guidelines for further improvement of the School's activities.
