

XXI De Girard International Young Pianists Competition

THE COMPETITION REGULATIONS

1. The Competition is organized by the I.J. Paderewski Music Society in Żyrardów under the Honorary Patronage of the I.J. Paderewski 1st and 2nd degree National Music School in Żyrardów.
2. The Competition is held under the Honorary Patronage of the Mayor of the City of Żyrardów.
3. De Girard International Young Pianists Competition is a continuation of the Żyrardów Young Pianists Competition – next edition with an international scope.
4. The Competition auditions will be held on **24–26 May 2024** in the Resursa Hall in Żyrardów, at ul. 1 Maja 45.
5. The Competition is open to the students of Music Schools as well as Music Academies.
6. The Competition auditions will take place in the following groups:
group I – up until 10 years of age
group II – up until 13 years of age
group III – up until 16 years of age
group IV – up until 19 years of age
group V – up until 23 years of age
7. For participants from abroad, the Competition will have a hybrid form. They may participate 'on-line' provided they send a link to the YouTube recording of their competition programme.

The video recordings shall comply with the following criteria:

- the video shall be sent as one file (it shall not be made of various merged video files), recorded using a stand/tripod and an external microphone connected to a smartphone, photography or video camera
- the file shall be sent as original, i.e. it shall not be corrected in terms of the video or sound
- the video recording shall present the whole body of the performer
- the video shall be recorded in HD quality (the video quality is subject to verification)

8. Programme requirements:

GROUP I – two works diversified in terms of their character and style, including a work of a French composer (optional)

duration: maximum 6 minutes

GROUP II

- 1) a work of a Polish or a French composer
- 2) a fast-paced part of any sonatina or sonata, or variations or rondo (individual or as part of a sonata cycle)
- 3) an étude or a virtuoso piece

duration: maximum 10 minutes

GROUP III

- 1) a work of a Polish or a French composer
- 2) a sonata-allegro form or rondo or variations from a chosen sonatina or sonata or the Classical sonata (individual or as part of the sonata cycle)
- 3) an étude or a virtuoso piece

duration: maximum 15 minutes

GROUP IV - a programme of one's choice which includes at least one composition by I.J. Paderewski or a work of a French composer

duration: maximum 17 minutes

GROUP V - a programme of one's choice which includes at least one composition by I.J. Paderewski or a work of a French composer

duration: maximum 20 minutes

All works shall be performed from memory.

A Special Award will be provided for the best performance of a work by Ignacy Jan Paderewski and A "Filip de Girard" Special Award will be provided for the best performance of a work of a French composer.

9. Participants will be assessed by a Jury appointed by the organizer.

10. The Jury's decisions shall be final and irrevocable.

11. A non-extendable time limit assigned to groups I–V applies. Should it be exceeded, the Jury reserves the right to stop the performance.

13. In the case of resignation, the enrolment fee will not be reimbursed.

14. By applying, the participant accepts the Competition Regulations.

15. The organizer reserves the right to limit the number of participants. If this is the case, qualification for the Competition will be based on the first come first served rule.

16. The costs of travel, accommodation and food shall be covered by the participant.

17. The exact timetable of the Competition will be published on the School's website by 11 May 2024.

18. All participants will receive Participation Diplomas.

19. Participants will perform in alphabetical order.

20. The Competition will end with a Concert of Laureates and the diplomas and awards ceremony.

21. The laureates are obliged to perform during the Concert of Laureates.
