**RESOLUTION No. 32/2026
OF THE SCIENCE EVALUATION COMMITTEE
of 27 May 2026**

on the evaluation of the quality of education at a doctoral school

Pursuant to Art. 259(1) and Art. 262(2) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), hereinafter referred to as the “Act”, having reviewed the results of the evaluation referred to in Art. 262(1) of the Act, which was carried out by the Evaluation Team, the Science Evaluation Committee

positively evaluates the quality of education

at the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology

run by

the Military University of Technology.

This evaluation applies to the period from 1 October 2019 to 10 September 2025.

Justification:

On 28 November 2025, the Military University of Technology submitted for assessment a self-evaluation report concerning the quality of education at the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology during the period under evaluation. As part of the evaluation procedure, the Evaluation Team appointed by the Chair of the Science Evaluation Committee reviewed the submitted documentation and subsequently conducted an on-site visit to the School on 11 March 2026, during which it obtained additional information allowing for full verification of the submitted data.

The Evaluation Team stated that, during the period subject to evaluation, the educational process implemented at the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology was conducted in accordance with the quality requirements for education at level 8 of the Polish Qualifications Framework and the applicable legal regulations. The study programme as well as the individual study and research plans were coherent and adequate to the intended learning outcomes, and the educational process was individualized and properly linked to the doctoral candidates' research activities. The system for verifying learning outcomes and conducting mid-term evaluations functioned in a transparent and reliable manner. The academic staff involved in the education process possessed high scientific and teaching qualifications, ensuring an appropriate level of supervision and scientific support. The recruitment process was transparent and competitive, while internationalization activities, despite limitations resulting from the specific nature of a military university, included doctoral candidates' participation in international projects and conferences as well as support for foreign candidates. The effectiveness of education was reflected in the scientific activity of doctoral candidates, their publication achievements, and the progress made in the preparation of doctoral dissertations. At the same time, recommendations of an improvement-oriented nature were identified, concerning in particular the further strengthening of support for doctoral candidates at the final stage of education and the development of internationalization activities.

Consequently, the Evaluation Team decided to positively assess the quality of education at the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology during the period subject to evaluation.

Having examined the documentation, the Science Evaluation Committee decided as stated in the introduction.

An entity dissatisfied with the evaluation may, pursuant to Art. 262(4) of the Act, raise objections to this evaluation within 30 days from the date of delivery of this resolution.
