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Background

Under the umbrella of TRANSCAN-4 (CSA: Sustained collaboration of national and regional programmes in cancer research), 20 funding organisations have agreed to launch a Joint Transnational Call (JTC-2026) for collaborative translational research projects on **cancer metabolism**.

Participating TRANSCAN-4 funding organisations wish to promote innovative interdisciplinary collaboration and truly translational research projects.

Research projects submitted within this call should be based on novel ideas stemming from consolidated previous results and will be endowed with a strong translational research orientation. Project proposals should also clearly demonstrate their potential health impact as well as added value of transnational collaboration. Sharing of relevant results, data sets and/or resources within transnational research consortia is a prerequisite for funding.

Research proposals should be built on an effective, multidisciplinary and multi-professional collaboration between academic, clinical, epidemiological or public health research teams and industry. Researchers' exchanges within the consortium are encouraged.

In order to ensure target-oriented projects, availability of and/or access to clinical biomaterial banks (cells, tissue, blood, DNA, organs, fluids etc.) and related clinical data of subjects (patient cohorts with comprehensive clinical documentation and characterisation) must be secured and explained. Biomaterial banks must be maintained with "Standard Operation Procedures" (SOPs for extraction, transport, processing, storage and further usage) and previous use and benefit documented by respective publications.

Submission of proposals

The TRANSCAN-4 JTC-2026 will be implemented through a two-stage submission procedure: pre-proposals and full proposals.

Both pre- and full proposals must be written in English and must be submitted by the coordinator of the project as PDF files, using the form that can be downloaded from the [TRANSCAN website](#).

The submission must be made through the dedicated electronic submission system PT-Outline exclusively, at <https://ptoutline.eu/app/TRANSCAN-JTC2026>.

Registration is required before submission of the proposal.

Original signed versions of either pre- or full proposals are not required. For the second stage, please note that full proposals will only be accepted from applicants explicitly invited by the JCS to submit them.

Both pre-proposals and full proposals must be submitted **within the deadlines indicated below**. Please note that in addition the submission of the proposal via the central online submission system, a submission of documents on the national level might be necessary. Please check below "ANNEX. National/Regional Regulations".

Call deadlines will be strictly enforced and the electronic system will not allow submissions after call deadlines. Please take into account that online data entry may be overloaded on the deadline. It is therefore recommended to upload all the required material in due time.

Partners

In case of interest in finding partners to the consortium, it is recommended to use the Partner Search Tool - Partfinder, provided by National Centre for Research and Development (NCBR) on the website <https://partfinder.ncbr.gov.pl>. The usage of the aforementioned tool is voluntary and free of charge.¹

Eligibility check

Prior to proposal submission, applicants should contact the respective national/regional funding organisation contact persons and refer to the national/regional eligibility criteria and requirements (Annex 1).

NOTE: An eligibility check before pre-proposal submission is mandatory for the following funding organisations:

1. *Ministero della Salute (IT-MOH), Italy*
2. *Fondazione Regionale per la Ricerca Biomedica (FRRB), Lombardy, Italy*
3. *Tuscany Region (RT), Italy*
4. *National Institute of Health Carlos III (ISCIII) and The Scientific Foundation of the Spanish Association Against Cancer (FCAECC), Spain*
5. *Chief Scientist Office, Ministry of Health (CSO-MOH), Israel*

Please read national/regional regulations (Annex) and contact the national/regional contact persons.

After submission, the JCS will check proposals to ensure that they meet the call's formal criteria (e.g. date of submission; number of research groups/countries, type of project partners: academic, clinical/public health and industrial/SMEs, document length, and inclusion of all necessary information in English). In parallel, the JCS will forward the proposals to the relevant TRANSCAN-4 national/regional funding organisations that will perform a formal check for compliance with their respective eligibility criteria. Proposals passing both checks will be evaluated by independent international scientific experts.

Please note that after submission it is not possible to amend the proposal or to add further documents.

Pre-proposal structure

One joint pre-proposal (in English) shall be prepared by the partners and be submitted to the JCS by the project coordinator.

Please note that it is mandatory that applicants use the pre-proposal application form provided on the [TRANSCAN website](#), and that pre-proposals comply with the length indicated for each section. Pre-proposals that do not comply with these rules will be rejected. Proposals must be written in English and submitted by the project coordinator as a PDF file through the electronic system exclusively.

Full proposal structure

Information provided in the pre-proposal application is binding for the entire application process. Thus, any substantial changes between pre-proposal and full proposal (e.g. title, acronym, composition of the consortia, objectives of the project, etc.) must be communicated in advance to the JCS with detailed justification and will only be allowed by the Call Steering Committee (CSC) under exceptional circumstances.

Please note that it is mandatory to use the full proposal application form downloaded from the TRANSCAN website and to comply with the length indicated. Full proposals not complying with these rules will be rejected.

Start of the projects and Consortium Agreement

In order to ensure a proper conduct of the project activities, a Consortium Agreement (CA) must be signed between the partners. The research consortium is strongly encouraged to sign this CA before the official project start date. In any case the CA must be signed no later than six (6) months after the official project start date. The CA must address the following issues: governance structure and decision-making process, responsibilities between the partners and subsequent liability, reporting, ownership and use of research results, IPR, publications, confidentiality. Upon request, copy of the CA will be communicated to the concerned TRANSCAN-4 JTC-2026 funding organisations.

Consortium partners of projects selected for funding will decide between them on a common start date for the project, which would be the reference date for yearly and final reports and extensions. The official start date shall be communicated by the project coordinator to the JCS and **shall appear in the consortium agreement.**

General Data Protection Regulation

The following Data Privacy Notice applies:

By submitting an application to the call, applicants consent to the use, processing and retention of their data, in line with the above notice and for the purposes of:

- processing and evaluating the application where processing shall be lawful -only if and to the extent that processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller;
- administering any subsequent funding award;
- managing the Funding Party's relationship with them;
- analysing and evaluating the call;

- providing aggregate data to regional/national and European surveys and analyses;
- complying with audits that may be initiated by the funding organisations.

The TRANSCAN-4 members² may share an applicant's data with third parties (some of which may be based outside the European Economic Area) in relation to the above activities including evaluators, auditors and the European Commission (or its agencies).

The TRANSCAN-4 members may link the data that applicants provide in the application with regional/national, bibliographic or external research funding data which is available through public subscription-based databases (e.g. Scopus, Web of Science, etc.) or other regional/national/open datasets.

The TRANSCAN-4 members may also link the data that applicants provide in their application with future data that applicants provide as part of the ongoing management and reporting.

Data on Funding Parties including contact details of CSC members are kept for the purpose of the call communication. The information will be published with prior consent of the respective management bodies.

Individuals working with municipal, provincial and territorial governments are also eligible where the research proposed is not already funded by that government sector.
- Appointments/positions that can be renewed prior to the end of the requested grant term are eligible at the discretion of the administering institution.
- Federal government employees are not eligible in the Nominated Principal Applicant role.

Additional Conditions of Funding:

- The Nominated Principal Applicant (NPA) will be required to submit, in addition to also meeting all TRANSCAN-4 reporting requirements, an electronic Final Report to CIHR. This online report will be made available to the Nominated Principal Applicant on ResearchNet at the beginning of the grant funding period and can be filled in as the research progresses.
- It is incumbent upon the Canadian researchers to review and understand all expectations of the call text, including the requirement for a Consortium Agreement (CA).
 - The CA specifies the relationship among the funded researchers, outlines how the project will be organized and managed, and includes clauses related to Intellectual Property and FAIR data.
 - The Nominated Principal Applicants who are successful in this competition will be expected to develop and sign a CA - depending on the composed consortium, different rules are applicable.
 - The successful Nominated Principal Applicant must consult the relevant country National Rules and Requirement in this Annex, discuss and plan with your consortium partners when a signed CA is required. It is noted that CIHR does not retain or claim any rights to IP in relation to research that it funds. Accordingly, the Canadian researchers retain full freedom in negotiating the CA required, including whether or not to accept the IP conditions.
 - The NPA does NOT need to send a signed copy of the CA, nor a declaration of the CA to CIHR. The TRANSCAN-4 Joint Call Secretariat will contact you directly for a copy should it be needed.

Funding applications submitted to TRANSCAN-4 will be held in jurisdictions outside of Canada and will not be subject to the provisions of the *Privacy Act*. Information submitted to TRANSCAN-4 as part of the applications will be governed by the provisions of EU data protection laws, the European Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Please note that all parties on applications must also comply with GDPR (2016/679).
