### **Number of victims**

Recent years have brought **significant challenges** in the area of countering human trafficking in Poland.

The protracted armed conflict in Ukraine and persistent tensions on the Polish-Belarusian border continued to **affect migration dynamics in the region**.


Poland, due to its geographical location and the assistance measures taken, remained a **key transit and destination country** for those seeking safety and better living conditions.



### Europe - Number of Victims 2022-2024


Poland, as a country bordering Ukraine and actively accepting refugees, has become a place of increased risk of human trafficking.

According to data from the National Prosecutor's Office, in 2024, **46 Ukrainian citizens** were granted the status of aggrieved party: 3 people were exploited in prostitution, **43 in forced labour**.







Europe - 2022 Number of Victims


We should not forget that **Poles** are also victims of human trafficking in other European countries.


#### Americas - 2022 Number of Victims






Central Asia - Number of Victims 2022-2024

There has been a small but visible increase in the identification of victims of human trafficking from Central Asian countries, such as Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan, who have been exploited in forced labour.

The growing number of migrants from these countries is a result of the **difficult economic**, **social or political situation** in these countries.







- and transportation


are at risk of forced labor. They are often forced to work overtime, without adequate compensation, and working conditions that fall far short of those promised.









### Form of exploitation of victims between 2022 and 2024
