I have a pleasure to present the 3rd issue of the newsletter of the Polish Embassy in Jakarta. The new edition of our semi-annual publication covers the first half of the 2021. Unfortunately this period was still marked by the global pandemic. Despite the unpredictable and difficult time the Embassy spares no efforts to foster and develop bilateral relations between Poland and Indonesia.

During the first half of the year the Polish Embassy reperesentatives organized numerous official visits and working meetings with various ministries, including Ministry of Trade, Ministry of Energy and a very important visit in the Ministry of Agriculture. Simultaneously, various initiatives regarding economic cooperation were undertaken by the Embassy in the first half of the 2021.

Several relevant anniversaries marked the first six months of 2021. Polish Embassy together with friends from Indonesia and V4 countries celebrated 30th anniversary of the Visegrád Group. The special international webinar was organized in order to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the decease of Polish geologist Prof. Zwierzycki, one of the pioneers of mapping of the Indonesian archipelago and its natural resources.

Polish Embassy in Jakarta also celebrated the 230th anniversary of the Constitution of the 3rd May. I hope that these events brought closer to Indonesia the spirit of the Visegrád Group, the courage and brilliance of professor Zwierzycki and the understanding of the importance of the first European (and second in global perspective) Constitution that was adopted on 3rd May 1791.

For the rest of 2021 let me whish all of you remarkable and peaceful time with the swift defeat of the COIVD-19 pandemic close on the horizon. I wish you a pleasant reading.

COORDINATION WITH KEMLU

ENHANCING TRADE COOPERATION

The role of traditional and innovative sectors in bilateral trade cooperation was also part of the discussion. 

PRIORITIZING ENERGY COOPERATION

Poland's economy is an impressive example how to succeed in decoupling of greenhouse gases emissions from economic growth (see chart to the right). Simultaneously, Poland is deeply involved in global climate change policy and has hosted a global climate summit already three times. During the COP 24 in Katowice governments agreed on the rules of the implementation of the Paris Agreement (so called Katowice Rulebook). Within this context Polish Embassy Jakarta promotes Polish areen including Polish green technologies, companies awarded within GreenEvo (see link below).

LINKING MINING INDUSTRIES

One of the aspects of energy transition is related to making the mining industry more ecological and efficient. The Polish mining industry offers the innovative technologies in machinery as well as ITC and logistic solutions. The detailed offer of the Polish mining companies was presented at a webinar for the Indonesian mining sector organized on May 20th by the Polish Trade Office in Jakarta (ZBH PAIH) in cooperation with the Embassy together with Indonesian Coal Mining (APBI-ICMA). Association The Polish-Indonesian cooperation in mining industry was initially discussed during the meeting between Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. and Cezary Filipek, from Polish Trade Agency (ZBH PAIH) with Mr. Hendra Sinadia, Executive Director of the Indonesian Coal Mining Association that was held on January 18, 2021.

COOPERATION IN AGRICULTURE AND FOOD INDUSTRY


Among priorities of the Polish Embassy in Jakarta the boosting and enhancing of the Polish-Indonesian cooperation in agri-food sector plays a prominent role. According to recent data exports of Polish agriculture and food products reached 34 billion EUR in 2020, an increase by 7% year to year. The rise in exports has been achieved even though supply chains, also in the global flows of agriculture products, have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, Polish agriculture and food industry have proved to be an effective and resilient partner, even in torubulent times. Poland has been reliable supllier of best quality agri-food products also for many countries in South East Asia.

MEETING WITH MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE H.E. MR. SYAHRUL YASIN LIMPO

To discuss the current state of Polish-Indonesian cooperation in agriculture sector Mr. Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. visited Ministry of Agriculture and met with H.E. Mr. Syahrul Yasin Limpo, Minister of Agriculture of the Republic of Indonesia. During the meeting, Mr. Firlus reiterated that Poland is ready to supply Indonesia with affordable and best quality agriculture and food products. The fruitful discussion brought some effects in the process of getting access for Polish apples and blueberries to Indonesian market. The main decision has been taken in the first half of the 2021 and the concluding procedural steps in that regard are currently processed by Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture.

Taking into consideration the importance of the process of granting access for Polish apples and blueberries to Indonesian market and consequnt procedures in shippments and deliveris, Ambassador Stoczyńska held the meeting with Director General of Horticulture at the Ministry of Agriculture, Dr. Prihasto "Anton" Setyanto. Furthermore, Mr. Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. had a virtual discussion with Mr. A.M. Adnan, Director of Centre of Plant Quarantine and Biosafety, Indonesian Agriculture Quarantine Agency.

Building up relations with agro-business remains one of the crucial aspects of enhancing cooperation in agriculture sector. In order to dicuss corporate relations Mr. Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. and Jacek Kołomyjec, Director of the Polish Trade Office in Jakarta (ZBH PAIH) held a working meeting with Mr. Harryadin Mahardika and Ms. Novalia Hartono, representatives of PT Agro Industri Nasional (Agrinas), one of important entities within the Food Estate Program. During the meeting Polish delegation underlined that Poland is ready to support Indonesian government and corporations by providing best quality and affordable food products, equipment and agrotechnology.



EXPLORING COOPERATION IN GAMING INDUSTRY

The gaming industry is considered to be one of the most interesting and prospective sector within the global economy. Poland is one of the world's leaders in developing of the electronic games. With that context Polish Embassy in Jakarta promotes cooperation between Polish and Indonesia in gaming business.

On February 24th Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. and Cezary Filipek representing Polish Trade Office in Jakarta met with Mr. Cipto Adiguno, President of Indonesian Gaming Association. The discussion covered various aspects of potential cooperation between Poland and Indonesia in gaming industry, including possible collaboration in business, education and human resources. RAILWAY COOPERATION ON THE RIGHT TRACK

Indonesia's railway plan for 2030 anticipates building thousands of kilometers of intercity and urban tracks in Java, Bali, Sumatra, Sulawesi, and Kalimantan. Poland, with its well-developed railway sector can serve as an important partner in implementing Indonesian railway strategy. Towards this end, the Polish Investment and Trade Office, the Polish Chamber of Railway, and the Indonesia Railway Society signed a tri-party Memorandum of Understanding. The MoU was finally concluded during the virtual meeting organized on 24 February by the Polish Embassy in Jakarta together with Polish Trade Office.

The parties of the Memorandum will now operationalize the specific areas where cooperation will bring most mutual beneficial outcome. One of possible solutions is the use of Polish specialized machines to set up railway tracks in Indonesia. Polish Embassy in Jakarta spares no efforts to bring the Polish technologies and know-how in railway sector to Indonesia.

BUILDING THE FIRE PROTECTION CAPACITY

"Poland has a broad offer of the state-of-art firefighting vehicles for Indonesia's fire protection agencies" said Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. when visiting the Jakarta Fire Protection Agency on March 17th. During the meeting with Mr. Suharja, the vice-head of the Agency Mr. Firlus added that Poland produces highly reliable firefighting vehicles and fire platforms, which can be customized to the customer's needs. The trucks are already successfully used by firefighters in South East Asia.

The Embassy also presented the offer of Polish firefighting trucks to authorities and fire agencies of Medan, Surabaya and Semarang. Additional meetings were held with the entities responsible for managing airports. During the meetings the risks of fires in Indonesia were discussed, including building and industrial fires or forest and pit fire. Polish technologies can vastly contribute to managing the fire dangers in Indonesia.

The Polish-Indonesian relations in defence and security education allow to share experiences and knowledge relating to developments of global and regional security environments, strategic perceptions or operational tactics and logistics. To discuss Polish-Indonesian ties in defence education the delegation headed by Piotr Firlus, chargé d'affaires a.i. and Colonel Zbigniew Kmiciński, Polish defense attaché in Jakarta visited in February the Indonesia Defense University (Universitas Pertahanan Indonesia, Unhan) and met Vice Admiral Dr. Amarulla Octavian, the Unhan's rector. During the meeting delegations discussed how to strengthen the cooperation between Poland and Indonesia in defence and security studies. The meeting was arranged during the working visit of Colonel Rujito Asmoro, Director for International Cooperation at the Unhan at the Polish Embassy in Jakarta.

NEW CONSUL ASSUMES THE POST IN JAKARTA

INTRODUCTION OF THE MOBILE CONSULAR POST





The consular section of our embassy is introducing the Mobile Consular Post (MCP), which will enable the consul to gather and register passport data outside of Jakarta. This will allow all the Polish citizens from the far reaches of Indonesia to apply for their new passport documents without having to come to the capital. The MCP will be fully functional in the third quarter of 2021. The consular section will announce the places, dates and timings of the MCP consular on the embassy's website **HERE** at least a week ahead.



When traveling, it is worth taking care of your psychological comfort - in emergency situations, especially in a foreign environment away from the country, it is good to have easy access to the most important contacts. **Polak za granicą** application contains a list of all Polish missions in a given country: from embassies to honorary consulates. It will also tell you where to get help when there is no Polish representative office in a given country. The app contains also other important information such as entry and customs regulations, differences in customs and local laws, safety issues.

Polak za granicą application is available at Android and iOS kiosks. The application was developed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Chancellery of the Prime Minister.

TRACES OF POLISH PRESENCE IN JAKARTA

Ambassador Stoczyńska and the representatives of Polish Embassy in Jakarta were exploring traces of Poland in Indonesian capital. The Polonia district in Jakarta is the place where the first Polish Consulate was organized. Some streets, shops and restaurants in this district still have names that refer to "Polonia".

Although the Embassy is focusing mostly on developing current and future political and economic cooperation between Poland and Indonesia, the history should also be perceived as an important factor that increases awareness of Polish-Indonesian relations.

The Polish Consulate (firstly a Consular Agency) was functioning in Batavia (now Jakarta) since 1921. The work of the Consulate was terminated in 1942, when the Japanese forces entered Indonesian archipelago.

Among Polish diplomats engaged in organizing and functioning of the Polish Consulate in Batavia the prominent role was played by Mr. Zygmunt Bronisław Przybyłkiewicz who was also a poet and writer. Mr. Przybyłkiewicz published a monograph titled "Dutch India" published in Poland in 1936.

30 YEARS OF VISEGRAD GROUP

In the middle of the 14th century three kings of Central Europe - of Bohemia, Hungary, and Poland - met in the town of Visegrád to establish new commercial routes. Six hundred years later, on 15 February 1991, the presidents of the Central European states formed the Visegrád Group (later known also as the Visegrád Four or V4), currently comprising the Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovakia and Poland. Since Poland held a rotating V4 Presidency in 2020-2021 the Polish Embassy in Jakarta prepared special events to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the Group and discuss the potential of V4 -Indonesia cooperation.

The room for increasing the V4 -Indonesia political and economic cooperation, V4 history and future plans - these topics were discussed at the webinar organized by Polish Embassy together with the Universitas Gadjah Mada to celebrate 30th anniversary of establishing of the V4. List of distinguised participants included H.E. Ngurah Swajaya, Director General for American and European Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Indonesia, H.E Judit Pach, Ambassador of Hungary, H.E Jaroslaw Chlebo, Ambassador of Slovakia and Mr. Radomir Karlik, Deputy Head of Mission at the Czech Embassy. Our guests discussed together with Piotr Firlus chargé d'affaires a.i. at the Polish Embassy the importance of V4-Indonesia cooperation. The discussion was perfectly moderated by Mr. Muhadi Sugiono from the UGM.

On June 21 Ambassador Stoczyńska participated in a working lunch with V4 Ambassadors and Director Bimantara Kemlu. The question how to foster the V4-Indonesia cooperation was again discussed during the meeting. The lunch was organized by the Embassy of Hungary in Jakarta. At the end of June Poland handed over the V4 presidency to Hungary.

PROF. JÓZEF ZWIERZYCKI – THE HERO OF TWO NATIONS

Year 2021 marks the 60th anniversary of the death of professor Józef Zwierzycki, a Polish geologist active in the Indonesian archipelago. Professor Józef Zwierzycki still remains a little known figure in the Indonesian history. As a Polish geologist serving in Indonesian archipelago in the first decades of the XX century, he became a father of the Indonesian geology. He drew the first geological map of some of the Indonesian islands and contributed to the discovery of Indonesian oil, gas and metal deposits. During the WW2 professor Zwierzycki was imprisoned by Germans in Auschwitz Concertation Camp, then sent to Berlin as a prisoner. Professor Zwierzycki was one of the first geologists who indicated the Lower Silesia region as a potential source of copper.



To commemorate professor Zwierzycki's legacy, the Polish Embassy and the Institute of Technology in Bandung (ITB) co-organised a special webinar on May 25, 2021. Four distinguished panelists from Indonesia, Poland and the Netherlands took part in the meeting. The webinar was opened by Ambassador Beata Stoczyńska and the Rector of ITB, Prof. Reini Wirahadikusumah. About 50 listeners participated in the meeting. More activities linked to prof. Zwierzycki achievements are envisaged in the second half of the 2021.

230TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CONSTITUTION OF 3 MAY



On 3 May 1791 the Four-Year Sejm also called the Great Sejm adopted The Government Act of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth later known as the Constitution of 3rd May. On that day Polish-Lithuanian state became the Europe's first and the world's second constitution that passed the basic law. For its time, it was a progressive and bold legal act which initiated a number of reforms. These included introducing of the principle of the tripartite separation of power, and reforming the existing political system to ensure more equal treatment of all nationalities within the Commonwealth. The Constitution also expressed the nation's will to defend Poland's independence following its first partition by Austria, Prussia and Russia in 1772. It also constituted a crowning achievement of the centuries-old links between Poland and Lithuania.

This year we celebrate the 230th anniversary of adopting the Constitution of 3rd May by the last King of Poland and Grand Duke of Lithuania Stanisław August Poniatowski

YEAR OF STANISLAW LEM



2021 is celebrated in Poland as the Year of Lem. Stanislaw Lem (1921 - 2006) is one of the most widely read non-English-language sience fiction writers.

He was a Polish writer of science fiction and essays on various subjects, including philosophy, futurology, and literary criticism. Many of his science fiction stories are of satirical and humorous character. Lem's books have been translated into over 50 languages and have sold in over 45 million copies. Worldwide, he is best known as the author of the 1961 novel Solaris, which has been fimed twice. Lem's science fiction works explore philosophical themes through speculations on technology, the nature of intelligence, the impossibility of communication with and understanding of alien intelligence and humanity's place in the Universe. His essays and philosophical books cover these and many other topics.



POLAND IN 3 WORDS





Irena Sendler

An activist, a social worker, a nurse. Before #WW2, she was helping single mothers, the unemployed, and the homeless.

From the beginning of the Nazi German occupation, despite the ban, she was involved in helping Jewish families. As a main activist of the children's section of the Council for Aid to Jews Żegota, she saved Jewish children by helping them escape from the ghetto and smuggling them into Polish shelters and families. She wrote down all the new and original names of the children she rescued on sheets of paper, rolled up and hid in, among other places, jars buried in a garden. Thanks to this, she gave these children the possibility of finding out their true identity. Learn more: HERE

Anna Walentynowicz

One of the 100 women who defined the last century according to Time! She was one of the founders and a member of the Free Trade Unions on the Coast, an illegal organization formed in opposition to the communist authorities.

She always bravely stood up against various injustices and violations of labour rights. This made her an object of persecution by the communist Security Service – detentions, revisions, threats, internment, imprisonment. She gave rise to #Solidarność, which in turn led to the democratic changes in Poland in 1989, and then throughout Eastern Europe. Learn more: HERE

Wisława Szymborska

The first Polish woman and the 9th woman in the world to win the NobelPrize in Literature.

Her work exudes wisdom, brilliance and a unique sense of humour. In her poetry, she valued most elevating the everyday to the extraordinary. She didn't like pathos.

She used to say: "Whenever I write, I feel as if someone was standing behind me and making clownish faces. That is why I am very careful and avoid large words as much as I can".

She was not only a poet but also a literary critic, essayist and translator of French Baroque poetry. Learn more: <u>HERE</u>

Wanda Rutkiewicz

A legend of both Polish and world Himalayism. At the beginning of her Alpine career, mountaineering specialists claimed that women were not suited to high-altitude climbing. Rutkiewicz broke this stereotype.

In 1986, she became the first woman in the world to climb K2, one of the most dangerous mountains in the world. In 1978, she was the first European woman to conquer Mount Everest. She loved challenges.

She wanted to conquer all 14 of the world's 8,000-meter peaks ("eight-thousanders") – she called the project her "caravan to dreams". In the end, she climbed eight of them. Apart from Mount Everest and K2, she reached the summits of Nanga Parbat, Shishapangma, Gasherbrum II, Gasherbrum I, Cho Oyu and Annapurna I. Learn more: HERE.

Olga Boznańska

She was known as a painter of silence or a painter of human souls. It was said of her that she didn't paint the eyes but expressions, not lips but a smile.

She worked in Kraków, Munich and Paris, where she was awarded Grand Prix at the 1937 International

She was known for her still life paintings, interiors and landscapes, but in her art the portrait reigned supreme. Her portraits were subtle and elegant in terms of colour palette, ambiguous and moody. Apart from the look, they captured the soul of the model, their character and emotions. She was recognised, successful, awarded with numerous prizes. She exhibited her works in Europe and the US. Learn more: HERE

Maria Skłodowska - Curie

Physicist and chemist, radioactivity, researcher and discoverer of two new elements: polonium and

The first and only woman in the world and the only scientist, to receive the Nobel Prize in two different scientific fields: physics and chemistry. The first female professor at the Sorbonne.

Her discoveries were significant breakthroughs in science and medicine, especially in the fight against cancer. Learn more: <u>HERE</u>

Maria Siemionow

From the 1980s she helped patients who lost in different accidents fingers, hands, feet, legs and those with extensive facial burns.

A distinguished specialist in microsurgery, plastic surgery and transplantology, in 2008 she led the team of doctors which during a 22-hour operation replaced 80% of the face of a female gunshot victim. It was the most extensive face transplant to date, requiring connecting numerous bones, muscles, nerves and blood vessels. The patient's jaw and palate, upper lip, cheeks, nose and lower eyelids were completely rebuilt, allowing her to recover the senses of taste and smell along with the ability to breathe, speak and eat independently. Olga Tokarczuk

She was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature 2018. In her books, reality and fantasy intertwine and are equally true. She writes to provoke thought in people a little – to make them question things that seemed obvious to them before.

Fictional characters built by her are authentic and internally convincing, among others, as a result of her psychology degree and professional experience in a psychiatric hospital and a mental health clinic. As she says: "I was fascinated by everything that was peripheral, eccentric and abnormal, any disorders, diseases, anything that challenged the so-called norm*.

Krystyna Chojnowska - Liskiewicz

Sailor, traveller, and naval architect. The first woman to sail around the world solo on her 31-foot sloop Mazurek, designed by her husband. She was racing against sailor Naomi James, who finished her voyage a month later.

Her solitary voyage started 45 years ago, and it lasted 2 years, till March 1978. She followed a course across the Atlantic, through the Panama Canal, across the Pacific Ocean, then around Australia and Africa. She sailed 28,696 nautical miles all alone. Her achievement was listed in the Cuinness Book of Records. Learn more: HERE
