



# **Engagement with Local and Regional Authorities in Development Co-operation**

#### **Poland-OECD seminar**

#### **Background**

Since 2018, Poland and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development – Development Co-operation Directorate (OECD-DCD) have worked together in the framework of a roadmap of collaboration for development co-operation policy reform. A number of activities and a series of reports have been carried out to support the country's capacities and strategic reflections, particularly towards the development of its <a href="https://document.org/2021-2030-Multiannual-Development Cooperation Programme">2021-2030 Multiannual Development Cooperation Programme</a>. In 2021, one of the areas of this collaboration is the engagement with local and regional authorities in development co-operation, which is explicitly recognized and valued in the new programme, leading to the organization of this dedicated seminar.

### **Objective of the seminar**

The 2030 Agenda calls for enhancing partnerships and concerted efforts of all development actors as well as the 'localisation' of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to meet the challenges of their implementation. According to the OECD, at least 105 of the 169 SDG targets will not be reached without proper engagement and coordination with local and regional governments. The Addis Ababa Action Agenda further stresses this urgency to address the growing financing and capacity needs at all levels of government in developing countries. In this context, decentralised development co-operation (DDC) – the exchange of financial and non-financial resources between subnational governments in developed and developing countries – is gaining even more traction as an effective approach to address the issues closest to citizens and to raising awareness and promoting the achievement of the SDGs. In the past decades, subnational actors, including cities and regions of OECD countries have played a crucial role in the sharing of knowledge, resources, experience and policy solutions to cities and regions in the developing world. Yet, their enormous potential to support the achievement of the SDGs globally is largely untapped. International aid remains overwhelmingly channelled through central governments. While 70% of cities worldwide engage in peer-to-peer exchanges, including cross-border partnerships and technical exchanges, only 1.3% of total bilateral official development assistance (ODA) is provided in support of cities and regions in developing countries.

This seminar, organised jointly by the OECD-DCD/FOR and the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs/ Polish aid, aims to facilitate a discussion and an exchange of ideas on engaging with local and regional authorities in development co-operation, focusing on the Polish context. It will be articulated around two main sessions.
