THE ADVENTAGES OF ADOPTION THE EU MACRO-REGIONAL STARTEGY FOR THE CARPATHIAN REGION

- Integrated use of **development potential** in a sustainable manner with the respect of the environmental and cultural heritage.
- → A tool for adaptation to climate change.
- → Building a common regional brand and economic promotion of the region.
- Joint intense development and boosting an investment attractiveness and innovativeness of Carpathians.
- Increasing the quality of life of the inhabitants.
- New partnership, building **cooperation beyond the administrative borders** and integration of the inhabitants of the region.
- Coordination of measures conducted in the region by the entities on different levels, regardless of national borders.
- → Better **access to financial resources**, to 2021-2027 EU Financial Perspective in particular.
- Increasing the presence of Carpathians in the EU and highlighting the roll of mountainous areas.

WHY NOT JOINT THE DANUBE BE STRATEGY?

- Because it occupies huge area, not completely overlaps with the Carpathians.
- The opportunities and challenges typical for mountainous features of the Carpathians could not be full addressed.
- The foundation of **common identity**that could be found in the Carpathians
 are the basis of cooperation and
 opportunity for quick and effective
 delivery of agreed goals.

The draft Macro-regional Strategy for the Carpathian Region was elaborated, December 2017. In Krynica Zdrój,
on the 5th of September 2017,
the representatives of the
Governments of Hungary,
Poland, Slovakia and Ukraine
signed the Carpathian Declaration
of Intent to Create the
EU Macro-Regional Strategy
for the Carpathian Region.

The Carpathian Declaration
was delivered to
European Council,
European Parliament
and Committee of Region
with a call to support the process.

Currently the information and promotion activities are conducted to add the initiative to the European agenda. The European Council shall formally open the works towards the EU Macro-regional Strategy task its preparation the European Commission.

Further activities towards the adoption of the EU Macro-regional Strategy for the Carpathian Region

- Reinforcing the efforts of signatories of the Carpathian Declaration to involve Romania, Czech Republic, Serbia and Moldavia in the initiative.
- Common choice of projects aiming to implementation of the Strategy.
- Including the Startegy to priorites of Polish presidency in Carpathian Convention 2020.
- → Promotion of the initiative during the thematically related events (f.e. COTER Group in CoR, ESPON Seminars, Expert Group TCUM, conference of TRANSGREEN project, bilateral meetings) – elaboration and realization of a Carpathian Road Map.
- Inclusion of funds for the Carpathian Region in the **Programm INTERREG**(2021-2027).
